


# A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935 the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan with the other founders offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938 a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. It, too, continues to this day.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1471 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce; the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-69 and from 1974-92. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned. During the 1960s the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed; these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was just completed for the opening of the 75th season.



# The Messiah May Be One of Us

This seems like an appropriate time of year to tell this story. With a nod to Benjamin Zander from his book, *The Art of Possibility* (and with special thanks to Doug Kohl for introducing me to the author) I give you "The Monks' Story":

A monastery has fallen on hard times. It was once part of a great order, but due to religious persecution in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, had lost all its branches. In fact, there were only the Abbot and four other monks left in the mother house, all of whom were over seventy. Clearly it was a dying order.



One day, the Abbot visited a nearby Rabbi to see if he could offer any advice that might save the

monastery. The Rabbi commisserated saying "I know how it is, the spirit has gone out of people." "Have you any advice that might save the monastery?" the Abbot asked "No, I am sorry," the Rabbi replied, "I have no advice to give. The only thing I can tell you is that the Messiah is one of you."

The Abbot returned to the monastery downhearted and bewildered. The monks wondered to themselves what possible significance the Rabbi's words might have. Did he mean the Messiah is the Abbot who's been our leader for so long? Or did he mean Brother Thomas who is a very holy man? Surely, he couldn't have meant Brother Phillip—he's too passive. But then he's always there when you need him. Or Brother Elrod—he's so crotchety. But then Elrod is very wise. Of course he didn't mean me—yet supposing he did?"

As they contemplated in this manner, the old monks began to treat each other with extraordinary respect, on the off chance that one of them might be the Messiah. And on the off chance that each monk himself might be the Messiah, they began to treat themselves with extraordinary respect.

Because the monastery was situated in a beautiful forest, people often came to visit. When they did, they began to sense this aura of extraordinary respect that permeated the atmosphere. As a result, their visits became more and more frequent, eventually bringing friends, and their friends brought their friends. After a while, some of the younger men, drawn to this enormously positive energy, asked if they might join. Miraculously, within a few years, the monastery became a thriving order once again, and – thanks to the Rabbi's gift – a vibrant community of light and love.

Respect is a core value at Weathervane Playhouse and I believe our renewed commitment to it is one of the main reasons why we find ourselves experiencing a real organizational renaissance. So, at this time of year (and all year long), let's never forget — the Messiah may be one of us!

# **About the Play and Playwrights**

# About the Play's Production History

A Tuna Christmas is a sequel to Greater Tuna – but even those who have not seen the first play will be able to fully enjoy the amusingly eclectic citizens in this Yuletide-themed outing. Creative collaborators Ed Howard, Joe Sears and Jaston Williams first created the "Tuna phenomenon" more than 20 years ago as a party skit in Austin, Texas. After this whimsical, improvised beginning, the men crafted a full-length play, Greater Tuna, which had its first production in Austin in the fall of 1981. Two of the creators, Sears and Williams, played all the characters in the play – and after much critical acclaim in Texas, the show took to the road.

The resulting *Greater Tuna* tour proved to be such a success that even "sophisticated" New York City took notice, and the show enjoyed a 13-month, 501-performance run off-Broadway at Circle in the Square Downtown. Next came a 1984 HBO cable-TV special, which increased the show's popularity.

By 1985, *Greater Tuna* ranked among one of the most-performed plays in America. And thus was born the idea for a sequel – *A Tuna Christmas*. In the fall of 1989, *A Tuna Christmas* had a "pre-Austin" try-out in San Francisco prior to opening in Austin in November of that year. In the years thereafter, Sears and Williams continued to tour across America with *A Tuna Christmas* show each Yuletide season. Ultimately, the two men took the show to Broadway in 1994, where *A Tuna Christmas* played for a limited run of eight previews and 20 performances. For his multiple-character portrayals, Sears was nominated for a Tony Award for Best Actor in a Play. In the years since, two more plays have been added to the Tuna canon – *Red, White and Tuna and Tuna Does Vegas*. As of December 2010, Sears and Williams are still touring with *A Tuna Christmas*, which is booked for several engagements in Tennessee and Texas between now and January 2011. # About the Playwrights

ED HOWARD collaborated with Joe Sears and Jaston Williams to create the four Tuna plays (and their multitudinous characters): *Greater Tuna; A Tuna Christmas; Red, White and Tuna;* and *Tuna Does Vegas.* His other plays include *Romeo and Thorazine, I'm Not Lying, Morning Star, A Little Iffy, Splendora, The Tempest Tossed* (co-written with Dennis West), and *Coming Attractions* (based on the novel *Daisy Fay and the Miracle Man* by Fannie Flagg). As a director, his Broadway credits include *A Tuna Christmas* and his off-Broadway credits include *Greater Tuna, A Tuna Christmas* and Romulus Linney's *Laughing Stockby* (starring Frances Sternhagen).

JOE SEARS collaborated with Ed Howard and Jaston Williams to create the four Tuna plays (and their multitudinous characters): *Greater Tuna; A Tuna Christmas; Red, White and Tuna;* and *Tuna Does Vegas.* For his performance in *A Tuna Christmas,* he received a 1995 Tony Award nomination for Best Actor in a Play. His other acting credits include many roles in summer stock, outdoor drama, a season at TheatreworksUSA in New York City, television, films and several Shakespeare plays. He wrote the Cherokee Nation's outdoor drama, *Trail of Tears,* which runs during the summer months in Tahlequah, Oklahoma. Among his awards, he received the 1993 Los Angeles Dramalogue Award for Best Actor in *A Tuna Christmas* and the Theatre L.A. Ovation Award for Best Actor in 1999.

JASTON WILLIAMS collaborated with Ed Howard and Joe Sears to create the four Tuna plays (and their multitudinous characters): *Greater Tuna; A Tuna Christmas; Red, White and Tuna;* and *Tuna Does Vegas*. For his performance in *A Tuna Christmas,* he received a nomination for Washington D.C.'s Helen Hayes Award, and he holds another Helen Hayes Award nomination for his performance in *The Foreigner*. His hometown is Austin, Texas, where he has appeared at the State Theatre in *The Chairs* and at the Zachary Scott Theatre in *The Laramie Project* and *Tru* (for the latter of which he received the Austin Critics Table Award for Best Actor in a drama). As a playwright, his shows include *Romeo and Thorazine, I'm Not Lying* and *Cowboy Noises*. Among his awards, he received the L.A. Dramalogue Award for both *Greater Tuna* and *A Tuna Christmas* and the Texas Governor's Award for Outstanding Contribution to the Arts by a native Texan.
