



A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members—Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch—and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works—even opera—with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 84th season.



The History Panels were created nine years ago to celebrate Weathervane's 75th year of continuous operation. Weathervane is now celebrating its 84th Season. The panels depict different chapters of the Weathervane story, representing who we were and the journey that brought us to where we are today. They illustrate:

The Founders, created Weathervane. There would be no organization without our Four Founders, each of whom brought her own set of skills to the project.

The Buildings, have been very much a part of who we are, just as much as the people who filled them with their talents in drama and music.

Women's Board, had its origins in service to the Theatre. The Women's Board has now become The Volunteer Guild, which continues to provide service to Weathervane in many ways.

Education, was at the forefront in the minds of our Founders. This continues to be an important aspect of Weathervane's mission.

A Life in the Theatre-honors those volunteers who started their acting careers at the beginning of Weathervane's existence—from the Marshall Avenue Barn through the Copley Road years, and who also spent significant time at the new building here at Weathervane Lane. Robert and Florence Beard, Margaret McKinley Moore, and Noble S. "Jim" Elderkin were all charter members of Weathervane.

The late Alan Scott Ferrall, Scenic Designer/Technical Director, worked tirelessly with the help of volunteers to gather all the information, photos, clippings etc. and was able to organize everything into these beautiful panels. He also wrote all the text for the panels. It was an heroic undertaking that was also a labor of love for him. He was kind, generous, and wonderfully talented man who was devoted to Weathervane.



THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK is presented through special arrangement with Samuel French, Inc.

ANNE FRANK (Diarist) Annelies Marie "Anne" Frank (June 12, 1929 to March 1945) was a world-famous German-born diarist and World War II Holocaust victim. Her work, *The Diary of Anne Frank*, has been read by millions. Fleeing Nazi persecution of Jews, the family moved to Amsterdam and later went into hiding for two years. During this time, Frank wrote about her experiences and wishes. She was 15 when the family was found and sent to concentration camps, where she died.

FRANCES GOODRICH and ALBERT HACKETT began their enormously successful and remarkably prolific collaboration in 1928, a partnership that lasted 34 years. The privileged daughter of well-to-do parents, Frances Goodrich attended Vassar before beginning her career as an actress, first appearing on Broadway in 1916. By the time she met fellow actor Albert Hackett in the late 1920s she had already been divorced twice. Nine years the junior of his wife, Albert Hackett was the son of stage star Florence Hackett and brother of matinee idol Raymond Hackett. The Manhattan-born Albert first appeared onstage at the age of six to help earn money for his family after the death of his father. He eventually went on to study at New York's Professional Children's School. Like Goodrich, Hackett met with modest success as an actor, and their initial collaboration arose as a result of their mutual desire to leave acting in favor of playwriting. The two were married while collaborating on their first Broadway hit, Up Pops the Devil. Their success on Broadway eventually led to the pair being signed as a writing team by MGM, where they launched the popular Thin Man series. While there would be another Broadway production on the Goodrich/Hackett docket in the 1940s, The Great Big Doorstep, for the most part the couple devoted their time to screen writing. They were particularly skilled at adapting the works of others to meet the restrictions and requirements of the movies. Among their most famous film credits were adaptations of Owen Wister's The Virginian, S.N. Behman's The Pirate, Edward Streeter's Father of the Bride, and the musical version of Stephen Vincent Benet's Sobbin' Women, released as Seven Brides for Seven Brothers. Goodrich and Hackett were also among the many writers who toiled on Frank Capra's It's a Wonderful Life. Writing the stage version of The Diary of Anne Frank was the achievement of which both Goodrich and Hackett were most proud. The job of adapting the diary had originally been offered to Lillian Hellman, who turned it down, saying that if she wrote the play "It would run one night because it would be deeply depressing." She, in turn, recommended Goodrich and Hackett because they possessed a "lighter touch." It took the couple two years and eight rewrites before they came up with a draft which pleased Otto Frank, Anne's father. The original Broadway production received the 1956 Tony Award for Best Play, and the script received the 1956 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. Goodrich and Hackett also adapted the play for the screen in 1959. Frances Goodrich and Albert Hackett remained married until her death in 1984. Albert Hackett passed away in 1995.


Wendy Kesselman received a Tony Award nomination for her adaptation of The Diary of Anne Frank, which was produced on Broadway in 1997. Her plays include My Sister in this House; The Notebook; The Last Bridge; I Love You, I Love You Not; The Executioner's Daughter; The Juniper Tree, A Tragic Household Tale; Maggie Magalita; Merry-Go-Round; Becca, A Musical; a musical adaptation of Dickens' A Tale of Two Cities; and a musical adaptation of Chekhov's The Black Monk. A member of the Dramatists Guild, she is the recipient of the New England Theatre Conference Major Award for outstanding creative achievement in the American theatre, the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, the first annual

Playbill Award, the Roger L. Stevens Award, the Jane Chambers Playwriting Award, the Lecomte du Noüy Annual Award, and a Guggenheim, McKnight, and two National Endowment for the Arts fellowships. She is also a seven-time winner of the ASCAP Popular Award in Musical Theatre. Ms. Kesselman's screenplays include Sister My Sister (adapted from My Sister in the House), directed by Nancy Meckler; I Love You, I Love You Not (adapted from her play of the same name), directed by Billy Hopkins; and Mad or in Love for Fox 2000. Her screen adaptation of John Knowles' A Separate Peace, directed by Peter Yates, aired on Showtime, won a Writers Guild of America award, and was nominated for an Emmy.

First, I would like to thank Chief Executive Artistic Director Melanie Pepe for allowing me the opportunity to express Wendy Kesselman's adaptation of the Frances Goodrich and Albert Hackett classic adaptation of *The Diary of Anne Frank*. Despite the constant discrimination and torment that, Anne Frank, her family, and the Jewish Community faced, their hope and resiliency touched me as an African American. The parallels between both communities speak volumes. Thank you to the amazing cast and crew on this emotional and historical journey of an heroic figure who will live on forever.



working with such talented actors on a very important play.




