

A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works - even opera - with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935 the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan with the other founders offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department, In 1938 a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. It, too, continues to this day.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1471 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-69 and from 1974-92. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned. During the 1960s the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was just completed for the opening of the 75th season.

About the Musical and its Creators

About the Show's History

Shortly before Christmas, 1971, Martin Charnin, a lyricist and director, bought a collection of *Little Orphan Annie* comic strips and began imagining a musical comedy based on the main character. After convincing librettist Thomas Meehan and composer Charles Strouse to join him in writing the show, Charnin and his collaborators created the musical in 14 months. However, it took four and a half years to get to Broadway because no producer thought it stood a chance.

Annie tried out at the Goodspeed Opera House in Connecticut, where Andrea McCardle began in the role of Annie shortly before the opening. At Goodspeed, the show won the approval of Mike Nichols, who offered to produce it on Broadway. After a highly successful run at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., the show opened on Broadway on April 21, 1977, and was quickly embraced by theatergoers. Next came four road companies of Annie, which toured the United States for three-and-a-half years. In 1982, a major motion picture version (starring Albert Finney as Daddy Warbucks, Aileen Quinn as Annie, Ann Reinking as Grace and Carol Burnett as Miss Hannigan) was released. The Broadway production -- which had cost \$800,000 to produce in 1977 -- ended up earning a profit of \$20 million (including the \$9.5 million deal for the movie rights).

Since 1977, the world has seen 27 major international productions of *Annie*, and it has been revived yearly in Tokyo for the past 16 years. An *Annie* newsletter is sent out bi-monthly and the musical score is known world-wide.

A made-for-television version of *Annie*, produced by the Walt Disney Company, aired on the ABC-TV network in November 1999. This version -- which won two Emmy Awards -- starred Kathy Bates as Miss Hannigan, Victor Garber as Daddy Warbucks, Alan Cumming as Rooster Hannigan, Audra McDonald as Grace and Kristin Chenoweth as Lily.

Weathervane Playhouse first presented *Annie* in 1994 as part of its Mainstage Series and revived the show in 1995 as an extra "holiday show."

About the Show's Creators

THOMAS MEEHAN (book) received his first Tony Award in 1977 for writing the book of *Annie*, which was his first Broadway show, and has since written the books for the musicals *I Remember Mama*, *Ain't Broadway Grand* and *Annie Warbucks*. In addition, he is an Emmy-Award winning writer of television comedy, and a collaborator on a number of screenplays, including Mel Brooks' *Spaceballs*. He received the Tony Award for co-writing the book for *The Producers* in 2001 and in 2003 for co-writing the book for *Hairspray*.

CHARLES STROUSE (music) won his first Tony Award for his first Broadway musical, *Bye Bye Birdie* (1960). In 1970, *Applause*, starring Lauren Bacall, achieved the same honors. His smash hit, *Annie* (1977), also won a Tony for Best Score as well as two Grammy Awards. Some of his other musicals include *All American; Golden Boy* (starring Sammy Davis, Jr.); *It's a Bird, It's a Plane, It's Superman; I and Albert* and *Dance a Little Closer*.

His film scores include Bonnie & Clyde, The Night They Raided Minsky's, and All Dogs Go to Heaven. Those Were The Days, the theme song for TV's All in the Family is a Strouse song, with lyrics by Lee Adams.

Cool fact: Weathervane Director of Education Melanie Pepe and *Annie* director/choreographer, Sarah Bailey, recently had the pleasure of meeting Charles Strouse. Stop by the Box Office to see his signature on a Weathervane postcard for *Annie*.

MARTIN CHARNIN (lyrics) has been the director, lyricist, composer, librettist, producer or combination of the aforementioned for over 75 theatrical productions including Annie, Annie Warbucks, the rock-opera version of Joan of Arc, Mata Hari, Loose Lips, Star-Crossed, Sid Caesar & Company, Carnal Knowledge, In Persons with Eli Wallach and Anne Jackson, The Flowering Peach, Winchell, the revised production of Cole Porter's Can-Can (for which he wrote the book), Café Crown, Mike, Laughing Matters, The No Frills Revue, Upstairs at O'Neal's, The First, On the Swing Shift, A Little Family Business, The National Lampoon Show, Lena Horne: The Lady and Her Music, I Remember Mama, Hot Spot, Zenda, Put It in Writing, Fallout, Kaleidoscope, Ballad for a Firing Squad, La Strada, Nash At Nine, Two by Two and, in London, Bar Mitzvah Boy, two productions of Annie, Bless the Bride and The 91/2 Quid Revue.

Charnin has received four Tony nominations, two Tony Awards, seven Grammy Awards, three Emmy Awards, three Gold Records, two Platinum Records, six Drama Desk Awards, and a Peabody Award for Broadcasting.

About Our Directors



SARAH ELAINE BAILEY (Director/Choreographer) this past fall marked her ninth consecutive year as the director of Weathervane's annual Young Actor Series production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. Last summer, she directed our production of Rodgers and Hammerstein's Cinderella. Her other Weathervane directorial credits include 2010's Seussical, 2009's Madeline and the Gypsies, 2008's Go, Dog. Go! and 2006's Madeline's Rescue. As a performer on the Weathervane stage, this past June and July she played Trix (the aviatrix) in The Drowsy Chaperone. Other Weathervane performance credits include Sister Margaretta in 2006's The Sound of Music and Sister Amnesia in 2004's Nunsense (for which she won a Chanticleer Award, the Playhouse's version of the Tony Award!). She has taught Weathervane youth-theater classes for

nearly a decade and she is a frequent performer with The Not-Ready-for-Mainstage Players at the Playhouse's annual Chanticleer Awards ceremony. Since September 2010, as Weathervane's Education Outreach Coordinator, she has also assisted the Playhouse's education department in coordinating the hiring and training of the many teachers who staff our participation in Akron After School (on-site, after-school theater-education classes at dozens of Akron Public Schools facilities). She received her bachelor's degree in music from Ohio Northern University and her master's degree in music and pedagogy from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. She has sung at Carnegie Hall with the New York Philharmonic and was a grand finalist in Guangdong, China, International Vocal Competition and has also performed at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in Scotland. Her favorite roles include Adele in *Die Fledermaus*, Juliette in *Romeo and Juliette* and a Cherubino in *Le Nozze de Figaro*. Her grandest roles, however, are as mother to three daughters -- Isabelle, Sophia and Cecilia -- and as wife to her husband, Kyle Bailey, with whom she makes her home in Cuyahoga Falls.

Director's Notes

This curly haired young eager director, choreographer and star was none other than Me!

During a recent visit to New York, I had the privilege of sitting down and talking to the composer of Annie, Charles Strouse. The idea for the show was that of the lyricist, Martin Charnin. Charnin thought this beloved comic strip would be a great idea for a new Broadway musical. Martin shared the idea with Strouse and they began writing. Unfortunately, the producers were on the fence and the project was scrapped. It was not until one of those same producers caught himself singing the song Tomorrow a year later and he thought, if it stuck with him that long, it might just be a hit! Strouse continued to compose the music while he was working for a local advertising agency. As a matter of fact, the original opening number of Annie started with a few burns singing a song called I Used To Be a Millionaire. The lyricist and director felt that the opening scene was not working. Strouse played a wonderful yearning melody that he wrote as a jingle for beer (I know!!). This jingle turned into the opening song Maybe.

As you listen and watch the story unfold, I hope that you will be filled with hope and love. This family-friendly show makes you laugh, smile and cry, not to mention leaving the theatre singing your favorite tune. And yes, I still have the record!



SHARON DOBBINS ALBERSON (Music Director) is a graduate of Kent State University School of Music and was a Blossom Music Scholar with the Cleveland Orchestra. A graduate of The University of Akron School of Law, Harvard Divinity School and Oxford University, Sharon is a minister, lawyer and musician. Jasen also won the 2009 Marquee Award for Best Costume Design from the Youngstown Area Community Theatre Association for his work on *Children* of Eden. His other regional costume-design credits include Porthouse Theatre, Case Western Reserve University and the Ohio Light Opera (Pirates of Penzance, The Mikado, Robin Hood and The Merry Widow).
