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
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A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members-Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troeschand a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works-even opera-with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 84th season.

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

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

Weathervane's 75th Anniversary Display-The History Panels-Created by Alan Scott Ferrall

The History Panels were created eight years ago to celebrate Weathervane's 75th year of continuous operation. Weathervane is now celebrating its 84th Season. The panels depict different chapters of the Weathervane story, representing who we were and the journey that brought us to where we are today. They illustrate:

<u>The Founders</u> There would be no Weathervane without our Four Founders, each of whom brought her own set of skills to the project.

<u>The Buildings</u> in which we performed are very much a part of who we are, just as much as the people who filled them with their talents in drama and music.

<u>Women's Board</u> which had its origins in service to the Theatre. The Women's Board has now become The Volunteer Guild, which continues to provide service to Weathervane in many ways.

<u>Education</u> which, of course, was at the forefront in the minds of our Founders. This continues to be an important aspect of Weathervane's mission.

<u>A Life in the Theatre</u> These panels honor those volunteers who started their acting careers at the beginning of Weathervane's existence—from the Marshall Avenue Barn through the Copley Road years, and who also spent significant time at the new building here at Weathervane Lane. Robert and Florence Beard, Margaret McKinley Moore, and Noble S. "Jim" Elderkin were all charter members of Weathervane.

The late Alan Scott Ferrall, Scenic Designer/Technical Director worked tirelessly with the help of volunteers to gather all the information, photos, clippings etc. and was able to organize everything into these beautiful panels. He also wrote all the text for the panels. It was an heroic undertaking that was also a labor of love for him. He is a kind, generous, and wonderfully talented man who was devoted to Weathervane.

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Musical Comedy

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Music by Charles Strouse Lyrics by Lee Adams

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MICHAEL STEWART (Book) won four Tony Awards: two in 1961 for Bye Bye Birdie as Best Author (Musical) and for the book as part of the Best Musical winner; and in 1964 for Hello, Dolly!, as Best Author (Musical) and for the book as part of the Best Musical winner. He was also nominated on eight other occasions: in 1962, with Helen Deutsch, as Best Author (Musical) and for the book as part of a Best Musical nomination for Carnival; in 1975, as Best Book (Musical) for Mack and Mabel; in 1977, as Best Book (Musical) and Best Score (lyrics) with Cy Coleman's music for I Love My Wife; in 1980, as Best Score (lyrics) with Cy Coleman's music, for Barnum; in 1981, as Best Book (Musical) with Mark Bramble for a revival of 42nd Street; and in 1985, as Best Book (Musical) for Harrigan 'n' Hart.

CHARLES STROUSE (Music) is an American composer and lyricist best known for writing the music to the musicals *Bye Bye Birdie* and *Annie*, among others. Strouse's first Broadway musical was the 1960 hit *Bye Bye Birdie*, with lyrics by Lee Adams, who would become his long-time collaborator. For this show, Strouse won his first Tony Award in the category of best musical, and *Bye Bye Birdie* is considered the precursor of the rock musical. Strouse's next show, *All American*, with a book by Mel Brooks and lyrics by Adams, came in 1962; it was not a success but it produced the standard "Once Upon a Time" (recorded by Perry Como, Eddie Fisher, Al Martino, Tony Bennett, Frank Sinatra, and Bobby Darin, among others). Following this were Golden Boy (1964, also with Adams), starring Sammy Davis, Jr. and *It's a Bird... It's a Plane... It's Superman* (1966, based on the popular comic strip) which was modestly successful; it introduced the song "You've Got Possibilities" sung by Linda Lavin. Strouse has won Emmy Awards for music in television adaptations of *Bye Bye Birdie* and *Annie*. He is also the recipient of the ASCAP Foundation Richard Rodgers Award and the Oscar Hammerstein Award. He is also a member of the Theater Hall of Fame and the Songwriters Hall of Fame.

LEE ADAMS (Lyrics) is best known for his songs for *Bye Bye Birdie*, but he was also the composer for Broadway's *All American*, *Golden Boy*, and *It's a Bird ... It's a Plane ... It's Superman*, and off-Broadway revues *The Littlest Revue* and *Shoestring '57*. He was educated at Ohio State University (BA), and Columbia Graduate School of Journalism (M.Sc.J). He wrote summer-camp shows at Green Mansions. His song credits include "The Arts," "Put On a Happy Face," "The Telephone Hour," "One Boy," "A Lot of Livin' To Do," "Kids," "How Lovely to Be a Woman," "Once Upon a Time," "What A Country," "Night Life," "Night Song," "I Want to Be With You," "Lorna's Here," "While The City Sleeps," "Yes I Can," and "You've Got Possibilities."







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


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
