



A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members - Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch - and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/ Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 81st Season.



A Christmas Carol: The Musical — with music by Alan Menken, lyrics by Lynn Ahrens, and a book by Mike Ockrent and Ahrens — is an adaptation of Charles Dickens' short novel of the same name, long treasured as a classic Christmas story. The creators were drawn together by the desire to make a show that could appeal to children who had never or rarely experienced live theatre. As Ockrent says in his original director's notes, "I hope that kids and families will experience the same thrill I had all those years ago of enjoying the show and the wonderful reminder that nothing need remain the same, that within us all we have the capacity to share, communicate and love each other."

Ebenezer Scrooge is a prosperous curmudgeon who believes personal wealth is far more valuable than the happiness and comfort of others. With an infuriated "Bah! Humbug!" Scrooge wants nothing to do with Christmas tidings and charitable giving — but he's forced to face his

selfish ways when three ghosts on Christmas Eve lead him through his own past, present and future. Thanks to their guidance, Scrooge recognizes his faults and greets Christmas morning with a cheerful "Happy Christmas!" before spending the day reconnecting and sharing love with those who mean the most to him.

Through the years of the show's multiple revivals in New York, several notable men played the role of Ebenezer Scrooge, including F. Murray Abraham, Tim Curry, Tony Randall, Frank Langella, Tony Roberts, Jim Dale, Roger Daltrey and Roddy McDowall (in what would be his final role on Broadway). In 2004, the musical was adapted for television in a production produced by Hallmark Entertainment. The television version featured performances from such talents as Kelsey Grammar, Jason Alexander, Jesse L. Martin and Jennifer Love Hewitt.

ABOUT THE SHOW'S CREATORS

ALAN MENKEN (music) has composed some of the most beloved songs and musical scores of our time. His work has introduced an entire generation to the world of musicals, on the stage and on the screen. In 1982 he collaborated with Howard Ashman to create Little Shop of Horrors, which became the highest grossing off-Broadway show ever, toured the world, won countless theater awards and resulted in a movie musical that earned Menken his first Oscar nomination for the song "Mean Green Mother from Outer Space."

On the strength of the success of Little Shop of Horrors, Menken and Ashman were hired to write the songs for the 1989 Walt Disney animated feature The Little Mermaid, for which Menken also wrote the score. The result was an Academy Award for the song "Under the Sea" and the Academy Award for Best Score. Beauty and the Beast followed in 1991, earning Menken two more Oscars for best song ("Beauty and the Beast") and best score. After Ashman died in 1991, and with the forthcoming Aladdin not yet completed, Menken began his collaboration with Tim Rice, to

complete the movie's remaining songs. Together, Menken and Rice won the Best Song Oscar and the Song of the Year Grammy for "A Whole New World," which also reached No. 1 on the Billboard charts. Menken also won the Best Score Oscar again. Menken's live-action film musical, Newsies, with lyrics by Jack Feldman, was released in 1992. Three more animated Disney musicals followed between 1994 and 1997 — Pocahontas and The Hunchback of Notre Dame (with lyrics by Stephen Schwartz) and Hercules (with lyrics by David Zippel) — with two more Academy Awards, for best song ("Colors of the Wind") and for best score (Pocahontas).

Among his many awards and honors, he has won eight Oscars, five Grammys, four Golden Globes, one Tony, and has received multiple nominations from the Drama Desk, the Outer Critics Circle, the New York Drama Critics' Circle, the Olivier Awards and the Drama League. He has been inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame and holds honorary doctorates from New York University and the University of North Carolina School of the Arts.

LYNN AHRENS (lyrics and book) won Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics' Circle Awards and received two Grammy nominations for Ragtime. She was nominated for two Academy Awards and two Golden Globes for the animated feature Anastasia. She has written both book and lyrics for seven musicals: Once On This Island (Olivier Award for best musical, Tony nominations for best book and best score); Seussical (Grammy and Drama Desk nominations); Lincoln Center Theater's Dessa Rose and The Glorious Ones (both Drama Desk-nominated); Lucky Stiff; Little Dancer and Madison Square Garden's A Christmas Carol: The Musical. She wrote lyrics for My Favorite Year; Chita Rivera: The Dancer's Life; Ragtime (2009 Broadway revival); A Man of No Importance (Outer Critics' Circle Award for best musical) and Rocky (Hamburg and Broadway). Ms. Ahrens is an Emmy winner and four-time Emmy nominee. Her many film and television credits include A Christmas Carol: The Musical (NBC-TV), Camp (IFC Films), Lucky Stiff (screenplay) and Schoolhouse Rock. She and composer Stephen Flaherty recently celebrated their 30 years of collaboration and received the Oscar Hammerstein Award for Lifetime Achievement. Her website is www.ahrensandflaherty.com.

MIKE OCKRENT (book) was born in London in 1946 and received a B.Sc. in Physics from Edinburgh University. In 1969 he won an Independent Television Award and was appointed Assistant Director at Perth Repertory Theatre in

Scotland. During the three years he was there, he directed over 20 plays. In 1973 he was appointed Artistic Director of the internationally renowned Traverse Theatre in Edinburgh, where he stayed for three years. Many of the plays he produced and directed then transferred to London.

Ockrent's Broadway productions include Once a Catholic, Rowan Atkinson's revue Atkinson at the Atkinson, Big (which received 10 Drama Desk Award nominations and five Tony Award nominations) and the world premiere of the concert version of the musical King David, written by Alan Menken and Tim Rice, the inaugural event at Disney's renovated New Amsterdam Theatre. He directed and co-conceived several productions of the celebrated Me and My Girl at the Adelphi in London (where it won the Olivier, Ivor Novello and Drama Magazine Awards for Best Musical) and on Broadway, where it was nominated for 13 Tony Awards and for which he also won the Drama Desk Award for best director. He also directed and co-conceived the musical comedy Crazy for You. The Broadway production of the show won three Tony Awards (including best musical of 1992) and the London production won several Olivier Awards (including best musical of 1993).

ALANAYA WILLIAMS


(Ensemble) is excited to appear on the Weathervane stage for the first time. She turned 11 on Halloween and says she's not scared of Halloween because it's


