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#### A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse


From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild,


The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951, the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 80th Season.





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


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
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


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
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#### Grateful Reflection


(the following are edited remarks from John Hedges' report to the membership on August 26, 2014)

As Weathervane Playhouse begins its 80th Anniversary Season, I can report that this theater has never been stronger or more capable of fulfilling the demands of its mission.

Over the last seven years we have literally transformed Weathervane into a more engaged contributor to our community and a place of considerable artistic vitality.

We doubled the size of our lobby and renovated every square foot of public space in this building to make Weathervane Playhouse a real jewel in the crown of Akron, Ohio.

What a treat it was to have Academy Award-winner Olympia Dukakis endorse our campaign in 2008 and 2009 and to have her come here to personally coronate this beautiful facility.



We also reached an all-time high in contributed revenue this season and total revenue for this theater has grown by 35% since 2007. Through all the ups and downs, we've been able to successfully balance our expenses in the aggregate with our revenue during my tenure.

In my opinion, this theater has also gone through an artistic renaissance as well. We've brought in exciting guest directors like Tony Award-winner Michael Rupert and co-produced the musical *Shine* starring Hal Linden with Mainstreet Musicals in New York City. We partnered with the theatre department at Kent State University and, under the leadership of Eileen Moushey, began our terrific new 10-Minute Play Festival.

These last few years have also seen us redouble our efforts to make Weathervane Playhouse a more inclusive organization. Under the direction of Jennifer Jeter, and with special funding from the Knight Foundation, we have been able to engage with the minority and African American communities in Akron in a way this organization has never before undertaken.

Our Education Programs continue to be at the forefront of proving time and again why Weathervane matters. I'm proud to say we have been able to grow those programs by 79% over the last several years to make Weathervane a major educational resource for our community.

Volunteerism continues to be strong with nearly 300 individuals dedicating in excess of 30,000 hours of volunteer time to Weathervane each year. These are people who come here because they love what theatre brings to their lives. That's why I'm not shy about trumpeting the simple fact that love is the foundation upon which this entire organization is built.

From where I sit, this theater has a very bright future.

I'd like to thank the Board of Trustees for their faith in me over these last seven years, the staff of Weathervane for their dedication and tireless work on behalf of this organization, and all of you for allowing me to be a part of the party that is Weathervane Playhouse.

The Roar of the Greasepaint -- The Smell of the Crowd is a comical, allegorical satire on the British class system of the 1960s. Through a series of sketches and songs served up in a style reminiscent of vaudeville, we meet the show's two central characters: the pompous Sir (who represents "the Establishment") and the downtrodden Cocky (who stands in for "the little guy"). Sir and Cocky meet to play "The Game," which symbolizes the eternal struggle between "The Haves" and "The Have Nots."

Because Sir changes and manipulates the rules of The Game, Cocky always ends up with the short end of the stick. Sir's disciple and sidekick, known as The Kid, is eager to learn from his master while keeping an eye on the upstart Cocky, who desperately wants to beat Sir at The Game. As the mighty battle wages between Sir and Cocky, a group of young children known as the Urchins comment through song and dance (as a sort of Greek chorus).

Ultimately, Sir and Cocky are forced to realize that their interdependence is more complicated and thorny -- and perhaps more potentially variable -- than either "Have" or "Have Not" originally thought.

Now celebrating its 50th anniversary, many of the songs from *The Roar of the Greasepaint* -- The Smell of the Crowd have become musical standards: Who Can I Turn To?, The Joker, The Beautiful Land, A Wonderful Day Like Today and Feeling Good (which was a hit song for both Nina Simone and Michael Bublé).

#### About the Show's Production History

Following the international smash success of their first show together (*Stop the World -- I Want to Get Off*), Leslie Bricusse and Anthony Newley went to work creating a new show together. For their new show's title, they playfully rearranged the phrase "the smell of the greasepaint, the roar of the crowd," which refers to the experience of theater performers. *The Roar of the Greasepaint -- The Smell of the Crowd* opened at the Theatre Royal in Nottingham, England, on August 3, 1964, and then toured the United Kingdom before its anticipated London opening. However, audience interest was minimal and it never reached the West End.

The American theatre producer David Merrick saw the show in Liverpool and decided to bring it to the United States. Merrick insisted that the show's co-creator, Anthony Newley, step into the starring role of Cocky. (One of the show's pre-Broadway stops was at the Hanna Theatre in Cleveland.) Tony Bennett released his own hit version of "Who Can I Turn To?" and Merrick persuaded RCA Victor to release the show's original cast recording before the show reached even New York City. By the time the show opened in New York in mid-May the *Greasepaint...* cast album had already sold over 100,000 copies.

After seven previews, the Broadway production, directed by Newley and choreographed by Gillian Lynne, opened on May 16, 1965, at the Shubert Theatre, where it ran for 231 performances and was nominated for six Tony Awards. Although the show did not win any Tony Awards (*Fiddler on the Roof* swept the major awards that season), the show proved to be popular and profitable on Broadway.

#### About the Show's Creators

**LESLIE BRICUSSE** (Book, Music and Lyrics), a double Oscar- and Grammy-winner, is a writer/composer/lyricist who has contributed to many musical films and plays during his career. He was born in London in 1931 and educated at University College School and Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge. At Cambridge, he was president of the Footlights Revue Club and founded the Musical Comedy Club. There, he co-authored, directed and performed in his first two musical shows, *Out of the Blue* and *Lady at the Wheel*, both of which made their way to London's West End.

His subsequent stage musicals include Stop the World -- I Want to Get Off; Greasepaint...; Pickwick; Harvey; The Good Old Bad Old Days; Goodbye, Mr. Chips; Henry's Wives; Scrooge; One Shining Moment; Sherlock Holmes; Jekyll and Hyde and Victor/Victoria. He has written songs and/or screenplays for such films as Doctor Dolittle; Scrooge; Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory; Goodbye, Mr. Chips; Superman; Victor/Victoria; Santa Claus -- The Movie; Home Alone; Hook; Tom & Jerry -- The Movie and various Pink Panther movies. He has been nominated for 10 Academy Awards, nine Grammys and four Tonys, and has won two Oscars, a Grammy and eight Ivor Novello Awards, the premiere British Music Award.

ANTHONY NEWLEY (Book, Music and Lyrics) was a British actor, singer and songwriter who was born on Sept. 24, 1931 in London. His first major film role was as the Artful Dodger in David Lean's Oliver Twist (1948). Newley had a successful pop-music career, with two No. 1 songs in 1960: "Why?" and "Do You Mind?" He won the 1963 Grammy Award for Song of the Year for "What Kind of Fool Am I?" With Leslie Bricusse, he wrote the musical Stop the World -- I Want to Get Off (in which he also performed), earning a nomination for a Tony Award for Best Leading Actor in a Musical. His other musicals include Greasepaint... (1965) and the movie musical Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory (1971).

Newley married and divorced three times. His first marriage in 1956, to Elizabeth Ann Lynn, was dissolved in 1963, the same year he married Joan Collins; they divorced in 1971. His third wife was a flight attendant, Dareth Dunn, whom he divorced in 1989. He was father to four children: a boy (Sacha) and girl (Tara) with Joan Collins and another boy (Christopher) and girl (Shelby) with Dareth Dunn.

His last feature role was in 1998 when Newley joined the cast of the BBC-TV series *EastEnders* in what was to have been a regular part. He withdrew from the role after a few months when his health began to fail. Anthony Newley died in Jensen Beach, Florida on April 14, 1999 of renal cancer.

To celebrate this milestone, we are featuring a selection of our History Panels, which were researched, designed and executed by Scott Ferrall, with the help of many volunteers. Also on display are several of Scott's favorite set designs from the more than 175 he's produced during his 16 year tenure as our Scenic Designer/Technical Director. To complete this exhibit, Jasen Smith, our Costume Designer and Costume Shop Manager, has provided some examples of costume illustrations with mannequins modeling the finished product. Since Jasen started working here in 2008, he has designed costumes for more than 50 shows.


The average audience member probably never considers all the elements that make up a production. The actors are the most obvious component. But, the set designer and the costumer collaborate to present the best possible picture on stage, along with the lighting designer. The costumer has to consider not only the era of the play, but also the colors of the costumes as they relate to the palette of the set. Every show is like a three-dimensional jigsaw puzzle. The set, the costumes, the actors, the lights, sound and props all have to fit together to present the playwright's words and vision of the play.

This exhibit illustrates two of those technical aspects: the collaboration of the scenic designer and the costumer. In addition, the work of many volunteers makes the magic happen. Scott has volunteers who help him with the set construction, the painting and the "set dressing" for every show. Jasen has volunteers who help him in the construction, sewing and finishing of the costumes.

There are volunteers responsible for running lights, sound and props for every show. Volunteers work in the Box Office, house manage, usher and staff the Gift Shop.

The vision of our four Founders had when they started this venture continues into the 21st century. Without such a strong volunteer base, Weathervane Community Playhouse wouldn't be celebrating 80 years of continuous performances. We hope this exhibit might inspire some to think about being "part of the show" and offer their talents to the Weathervane community. "Consider yourself at home, consider yourself part of the family."



In seven seasons as Executive Director, Mr. Hedges has led Weathervane Playhouse into a new era of vitality. Among the accomplishments during his tenure are growing the audience base by 24%, increasing total revenue by 31%, growing individual contributions by 57%, and the successful completion of a \$1.1 million capital fundraising campaign. A professional actor for over 20 years, his Northeast Ohio performance credits include critically acclaimed productions of Heartbreak House with the Cleveland Classics Project, God of Carnage at Dobama Theatre (2012 BroadwayWorld Regional Best Actor Award), and a special production of A Midsummer Night's Dream with the Akron Symphony Orchestra at EJ Thomas Hall. Prior to coming to Weathervane, John spent ten years in the Resident Acting Company at the historic Barter Theatre in Virginia where he performed in over sixty shows. Other acting credits include performances at Broadway's Town Hall, the Pantages Theatre in Los Angeles, Actors Theatre of Louisville, the Indiana Repertory Theatre, the Kentucky Shakespeare Festival, and the American Stage Festival in New Hampshire where he appeared opposite Academy Awardwinner Olympia Dukakis in The Cherry Orchard. Film credits include the award-winning independent film Freedom (2006 Best Supporting Actor Award, SA International Film Festival). An accomplished arts executive, Mr. Hedges has been Managing Director of First Stage Milwaukee, Associate Producer of North Shore Music Theatre, Business Director of Gloucester Stage Company, and General Manager of New York's award-winning Pearl Theatre Company. He is a member of Actors' Equity Association, served on the Board of Directors of Boston's StageSource as well as the Akron Area Arts Alliance, been a Conference Panelist for the American Alliance for Theatre & Education, and written for American Theatre magazine. He studied at Indiana State University, the DeVos Institute of Arts Management at the Kennedy Center in Washington, DC, the Professional Theatre Training Program at the University of Delaware, the National Shakespeare Conservatory in New York, and holds an honorary MFA degree in theatre from Stafford University.
