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
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
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
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
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A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members – Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLacklan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch – and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 82nd Season.

Established in 1961, Hattie Larlham is a nonprofit organization headquartered in Twinsburg, Ohio. The organization provides residential, medical, recreational, and work training services to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Statewide, 1,800 children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities receive services from Hattie Larlham.

Hattie's Creative Arts is an art program that empowers people with developmental disabilities to communicate through artistic expression. With the assistance of an 'Art Tracker', people with developmental disabilities paint, create ceramic pieces and take photographs. "Art Trackers" are professional artists who assist in carrying out another artist's vision. At Hattie's Creative Arts, the trackers are an extension of the artist's tools and supplies. The tracker establishes a functional communication system with the artist to ensure their project is successful. Utilizing charts and a complex series of "yes and no" questions, trackers respond to the artist's choices and answers by applying color, form and texture to the work in progress. As a result, the artist's ideas are translated into a tangible work of art. Hattie's Creative Arts is located at the Hattie Larlham Center for Children with Disabilities. 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ABOUT THE SHOW

It's 1962 in Baltimore, and the lovable plus-size teen, Tracy Turnblad, has only one desire — to dance on the popular *Corny Collins Show*. When her dream comes true, Tracy is transformed from social outcast to sudden star. She must use her newfound power to dethrone the reigning Teen Queen, win the affections of heartthrob Link Larkin, and integrate a TV show...all without denting her 'do!

You can't stop the beat in this big and bold musical about one girl's inspiring dream to dance!

ABOUT THE CREATORS

John Waters (Film) Growing up in Baltimore in the 1950s, John Waters was not like other children; he was obsessed by violence and gore, both real and on the screen. With his weird counter-culture friends as his cast, he began making silent 8mm and 16mm films in the mid-'60s; he screened these in rented Baltimore church halls to underground audiences drawn by word of mouth and street leafleting campaigns. As his filmmaking grew more polished and his subject matter more shocking, his audiences grew bigger, and his write-ups in the Baltimore papers more outraged. By the early 1970s he was making features, which he managed to get shown in midnight screenings in art cinemas by sheer perseverance. Success came when Pink Flamingos (1972) - a deliberate exercise in ultra-bad taste - took off in 1973.

Waters continued to make low-budget shocking movies with his Dreamland repertory company until Hollywood crossover success came with *Hairspray* (1988), and although his movies nowadays might now appear cleaned up and professional, they retain Waters' playfulness, and reflect his lifelong obsessions.

Thomas Meehan (Book) received the Tony Award for co-writing the book for *The Producers* in 2001 and in 2003 for co-

writing the book for Hairspray. He received his first Tony Award in 1977 for writing the book of Annie, which was his first Broadway show, and has since written the books for the musicals I Remember Mama, Ain't Broadway Grand and Annie Warbucks. In addition, he is a long-time contributor of humor to The New Yorker, an Emmy-Award winning writer of television comedy, and a collaborator on a number of screenplays, including Mel Brooks' Spaceballs and To Be or Not to Be. He and his wife, Carolyn, divide their time between a home in Nantucket and an apartment in Greenwich Village, near which, on Hudson Street, she owns and presides over the long-running and near-legendary children's store Peanut Butter & Jane. Mr. Meehan is a member of the Council of the Dramatists Guild.

Mark O'Donnell (Book) His plays include That's It, Folks!, Fables for Friends, and The Nice and the Nasty (all produced at Playwrights Horizons), and Strangers on Earth and Vertigo Park (both produced by Zena Group Theatre). He wrote the book and lyrics for the musical Tots in Tinseltown. Mr. O'Donnell collaborated with Bill Irwin on an adaptation of Moliere's Scapin and he co-authored a translation of Feydeau's A Flea in Her Ear, both for the Roundabout. For Manhattan Theatre Club he translated Jean Claude Carriere's La Terrasse. He has published two collections of comic stories Elementary Education and Vertigo Park and Other Tall Tales (both Knopf) as well as two recent novels Getting Over Homer and Let Nothing You Dismay (both now in Vintage paperback). His humor, cartoons, and poetry have appeared in The New Yorker, The New York Times, The Atlantic, Spy, The New Republic, and Esquire, among many others. He has received a Guggenheim Fellowship, the Lecomte du Nuoy Prize, and the George S. Kaufman Award.

Marc Shaiman (Lyrics) has been writing music, lyrics, arrangements, orchestrations and very lengthy Emails since entering show business at the age of 16, at La Ma Ma, in 1976.

He has won a Tony (for co-writing the score to *Hairspray* with co-lyricist Scott Wittman), a Grammy (also for *Hairspray*), an Emmy (for his work on Billy Crystal's Oscar appearances) and if he hadn't lost each of his five Oscar nominations (for *Sleepless In Seattle, Patch Adams, The First Wives Club, The American President* and *South Park-Bigger, Longer & Uncut*), he could boast of being an EGOT. Till then, he remains an EGT.

Other film work includes Beaches, When Harry Met Sally, City Slickers, The Addams Family, A Few Good Men, Sister Act, Hocus Pocus, The Bucket List, and Parental Guidance to name a few.

Scott Wittman co-wrote (with Marc Shaiman) the lyrics for the Olivier Award-winning musical *Hairspray*, for which the pair received Tony and Grammy Awards. He also served as an executive producer

on the hit film starring John Travolta. They teamed up again on Broadway for Martin Short: Fame Becomes Me, which he also directed, and Carch Me If You Can, which received a Tony nomination for Best Musical. For their original songs on NBC's musical drama Smash, Scott & Marc were nominated for two Emmy Awards, a Grammy and a Golden Globe. On Smash they have composed songs for Jennifer Hudson, Uma Thurman, Bernadette Peters, and Liza Minnelli. Their original score for the Marilyn Monroe musical "Bombshell" was released on Sony Records. Scott cowrote the lyrics to Charlie and Chocolate Factory directed by Sam Mendes. For Patti LuPone, Scott has created and directed two Broadway shows, three recordings and three sold-out Carnegie Hall concerts. At La Ma Ma, Scott conceived and directed Jukebox Jackie starring Justin Vivian Bond, Cole Escola, Steel Burkhardt and Bridget Everett.



Hairspray is timeless to me. Tracy is my hero. She's a girl who wouldn't accept the world as it was and is willing to do something about it. We need more Tracys as we continue to break down bigotry, chauvinism, narrow-mindedness, discrimination, and intolerance. We, like Tracy, need to see people as individuals and be willing to fight for and believe that we can create a better and more considerate world.




The influence of television was strong and everyone watched to learn the latest trends – the fashion trends that were "hip," what music was "fab," and, of course, which dances were "outta sight!" The world was changing quickly. Outside the iconography of the American dream on the black and white TV, the fight for human rights and equality was developing into a Technicolor reality.

I hope you take a bit of Tracy's spirit with you today. Together we can do a lot to overcome what has divided us. "You've gotta dream big to be big!"

In 1962, the cost of a dozen eggs was 32 cents. The mashed potato was a something you had with your dinner and a popular dance. Hairspray filled the air, and on your living room TV, squeaky-clean white teens danced The Madison and The Pony to the latest tunes. The only black and white combination on most television shows came from the lack of color on the screens. However, the world outside television was changing quickly, the fight for human rights and equality had begun, and the television scene was becoming a bright and

colorful world. 1962 was a time of change. A plus-sized teen heroine, Tracy Turnblad, breaks boundaries in a time when historic change was everywhere. *Hairspray* still holds relevance in today's society. I hope that you laugh, sing, and tap your feet through this upbeat, fast-paced show but take this lesson away — we as an audience must always continue to strive for acceptance in all people. Together, we can do so much more to overcome what has divided us in the past. "YOU can't stop the beat!!"
