#### A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse


From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.


The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951, the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 80th Season.





Welcome to Weathervane!

For the past nine years, I have had the pleasure of producing the Young Actor Series for Weathervane Playhouse. In that time, volunteer participation has quadrupled. There are many talented young people with a desire to participate in theatre and it has been my absolute pleasure to work with them.

As the series has grown, I began to recognize the need for different types of opportunities. Yes, the intent of the Young Actor Series is to provide opportunities to "young actors." But what is a young actor? Some actors young in age have performed in many productions, while others with more life experience have never had the chance to perform. And why only actors? Don't we want to provide opportunities for designers? What about those interested in learning to build costumes, hang lights or work backstage? Shouldn't this series, as an extension of the education program, have a mission to serve performers, designers and technicians? Should age be a restriction for these opportunities?



This unique series speaks to the heart of Weathervane's mission. It provides a way to enter into the world of theatre and discover your place in it as an artist. To this end, I would like to clarify the purpose of this series in its title. I invite you to consider the following words:

a person who performs as an actor, musician, singer or other public performer

I believe that "Emerging Artist Series" better encompasses the intent of what the Young Actor Series has become. I am proud to share with you the first production to carry this title, *Hamlet*.

Hamlet was written by William Shakespeare more than 400 years ago and it continues to be one of the most relevant plays of our time. Shakespeare's classic tale of revenge infiltrates and influences our culture in unexpected ways. From Disney's classic animated film *The Lion King* and *Sesame Street's Hamlet in Monsterpiece Theater* to FX's *Sons of Anarchy* and the *Star Wars* saga, Hamlet's story continues to be explored. #### **About the Play and Playwright**

#### About the Play, It's History and Adaptations

Hamlet, Prince of Denmark, has multiple woes. The ghost of his father haunts Elsinore Castle. His uncle, Claudius, has married Queen Gertrude, his mother, and assumed the throne. When Hamlet meets the ghost, his dead father reveals that Claudius poisoned him -- and the ghost demands that Hamlet exact revenge. In order to carry this out, Hamlet feigns madness. As part of his insanity, he scorns the affections of Ophelia, daughter of Polonius, to whom he had made romantic overtures. Polonius grows concerned over the apparent insanity that has beset Hamlet and reveals it to the King and Queen. Meanwhile, Hamlet struggles to convince himself that Claudius is the murderer of his father and, in an attempt to "catch the king's conscience," Hamlet convinces a traveling troupe of actors to perform a play in which the action closely resembles the events related to him by the ghost.

The Tragedy of Hamlet, Prince of Denmark -- most often shortened to just Hamlet -- is Shakespeare's longest play and has often been cited as one of the most enduring and influential works in all of English literature. Scholars report that Shakespeare wrote Hamlet at some point between 1599 and 1602. Though solid evidence is scarce, the first production of the play most likely took place in 1602.

The Internet Broadway Database lists 66 separate Broadway productions of *Hamlet* in the years between 1761 and 2015. A host of legendary actors have played the title role on Broadway including (but not limited to) such notable names as John Barrymore (two times in the 1920s), John Gielgud (1936), Maurice Evans (four times in the 1930s and 1940s), Richard Burton (1964), Sam Waterston (1975), Ralph Fiennes (1995) and Jude Law (2009).

Shakespeare's tragic tale has also been a popular source for movie makers. In 1900, the legendary English actress Sarah Bernhardt starred in a five-minute short film of the play's fencing scene. Film exhibitors were also given a phonograph record (with Bernhard reciting Shakespeare's words) and the record played as the film unspooled. Laurence Olivier directed and starred in a 1948 film adaptation that would go on to win the Academy Award for best picture. In 1969, English director Tony Richardson's version featured Nicol Williamson as Hamlet and Marianne Faithfull as Ophelia. Frequent Shakespeare adaptor Franco Zeffirelli cast Mel Gibson as the moody Danish prince and Glenn Close as his mother Gertrude for his 1990 movie. English actor and director Kenneth Branagh cast himself in the title role for his 1996 big-screen adaptation. Branagh's version is notable for his choice to retain all of the play's dialogue; consequently, his epic version clocks in at four hours and two minutes. Due to its length, the studio released two versions: a two-and-a-half-hour cut played in most markets and the full-length four-hour cut played only in select locations.

#### About the Playwright

William Shakespeare (1564-1616) married Anne Hathaway in 1582. They had a daughter, Susanna, in 1583, and twins, Hamnet and Judeth, in 1585. Shakespeare's early life was spent in Stratford-on-Avon. By 1594, he emerged as a rising young playwright in London and was a member of the preeminent theater company of his day, the Lord Chamberlain's Company (later to be known as the King's Men). The first collected edition of Shakespeare's plays -- known as the First Folio -- was printed in 1623. Though literary scholars and biographers still argue about his authorship of such a breathtaking body of work, Shakespeare is generally acknowledged as one of the greatest writers of all time. His plays, written in English in the late 16th and early 17th centuries, are to this day performed in more languages and with more frequency than those of almost any other playwright. Truly, the Bard of Avon's endurance and influence has more than fulfilled Ben Jonson's prophesy that Shakespeare was "not of an age but for all time."

#### **About Our Director - John Davis**



John Davis (Director) returns to helm another production at Weathervane, where he previously steered the direction of *Our Town* in 2013, *The Taming of the Shrew* in 2012 and the 2011 world-premiere production of *Art of Deduction: Inside the Mind of Sherlock Holmes* (which Weathervane Playhouse commissioned from playwright Derek Davidson). A professional actor, director and fight choreographer for the past 28 years, John is best known for his comedy sword-fighting show, *Hack and Slash*, which has been seen in 16 countries with over 4,000 performances (including more than 100 performances for the allied forces in both Iraq and Afghanistan). John has received certification from five major stage-combat organizations worldwide

and is a recognized instructor with the International Order of the Sword and Pen. John is also a professor in the theater department at Oberlin College. He has directed shows in Baltimore, Miami, Nashville, Annapolis, Montgomery and, closer to home, *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead* for the Cleveland Shakespeare Festival.

#### Director's Notes

When someone says the name "Shakespeare," it conjures up many thoughts and feelings. Often times, individuals find the bard's works to be not relevant to the modern world. It was one such conversation that sparked my desire to direct *Hamlet*. I have always found Shakespeare's themes to be timeless.

Hamlet, written soon after the death of Hamnet, Shakespeare's son, explores many esoteric ideas that everyone has pondered: What happens to us after we die? Why does life have to be hard? Why are we here? What part do we play in creating our life experience? This play is Shakespeare's personal journey while grappling with the death of his son and the deeper meanings behind life and death. Often, he cast himself in the role of the ghost (Hamlet's father).

It also asks the most poignant question that anyone can ask of oneself, "To be or not to be." It answers with a series of statements that opens wide the doors of modern metaphysics and allows the audience to broaden their own horizons. "There is nothing good nor bad, but thinking makes it so." "Words without thoughts never to Heaven go." "To thine own self be true." "I must be cruel to be kind." "There are more things in heaven and on earth than are dreamt of in your philosophy."

I am so honored to work with this amazing and talented cast on this incredible journey. I tried to create a safe environment where each actor could explore and discover and each actor brought such incredible and timely insight to these classic roles. Every day of the rehearsal process there were new personal discoveries. Tonight, allow yourself to explore as well and discover the themes and deeper thoughts that ring true to you.

I thank Weathervane Playhouse and, in particular, Melanie Pepe for the opportunity to direct this production. It truly has let me look at my life experiences in new and exciting ways. Enjoy!

#### In the Harris Family Gallery -- A Tribute to Jack Richard

Jack was a brilliant artist and made his living over the last 70 years painting more than 800 commissioned portraits, church murals, illustrations, etc. Jack did it all and his works are in many public and private collections around the world. He was the recipient of many national and local awards and citations. Jack established his Almond Tea Gallery and the Studios of Jack Richard in downtown Cuyahoga Falls in 1960. From there, he exhibited other artists, his own and students' work, and did art restoration and framing. He was painting, teaching and running his gallery right up to his death last August at the age of 92.

Most importantly, Jack was a great teacher, having taught more than 2,000 students. Several of his students have gained important national reputations, while others have become successful teachers, educators, gallery directors, portrait painters and landscape artists encompassing styles from magic realism to non-objective abstraction. He is now a professional painter (one of his paintings is in the permanent collection at the Butler Institute of American Art) and had worked with Jack for many years at the Almond Tea Gallery as a teacher, art restoration expert, and framer. Jack entrusted Mark with the task of continuing the Gallery after his death. Mark says, "Nothing was more important to Jack than teaching. He would tell us (the students) a story about asking his teachers, who numbered more than 20, 'How could he repay them for everything they gave him?' All of the answers were the same, 'Just pass it on.' And he spent his life doing just that."

Jack was commissioned to portray the Ambassador of Golf, chosen every year by the NEC Corporation since the World Series of Golf started in 1981. The Ambassador of Golf awardees are people "who have fostered the ideals of the game on an international level and whose concern for others extends beyond the golf course". Among the past Ambassadors, painted by Jack, are former Presidents George H.W. Bush and Gerald Ford, Dinah Shore, Bob Hope, Bing Crosby, Arnold Palmer, Gary Player, Sam Snead, Juan "Chi Chi" Rodriguez and Robert Dedman. The original portrait goes to the recipient, while a photographic facsimile is created for Firestone Country Club.

On a personal note, I modeled for Jack and his students on several occasions over the years. It was a joy and privilege to have known him. He is missed.
