





A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members – Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLaehlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch – and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 82nd Season.

Jesus Through the Ages

This exhibit features images of Jesus Christ as recorded from earliest times to the present. The display begins with what is believed to be the first image of the Crucifixion drawn on a wall. From ancient times through the present, as many cultures as possible are represented. Images from Asia, Africa, India, South America, North America, Europe, and Russia ranging from the early Christian days to the present are featured. In a way, viewing these images is like time traveling. The image of Jesus, depicted from the perspective of so many cultures, offers a fresh way of thinking of the importance of Jesus historically. Many of the images will be familiar, even iconic. The more contemporary pieces may be challenging to some. The overall experience is exhilarating as the beauty and diversity of the images of Jesus Christ are profoundly moving.

The rest of the exhibit features cinematic and theatrical references to Jesus Christ. These pieces are drawn from media sources and presented by Robert A. Kraus (RAK). He is the owner/creator of the independent company, RAK Graphics. His work was featured last season in the Gallery during the run of *Dracula*, and earlier this season during *Little Shop of Horrors*. Robert attended The University of Akron briefly before creating his self-published graphic novel character, *Chakan, The Forever Man*. This character was later made into a Sega Genesis Video Game in the mid 90's. He was one of the first independent comic book and game publishers and the sole designer and fantasy artist of the board game *Dragon War* and the hundreds of expansions to go with it. This is a game that is never played the same way twice. Robert is the creator of *RAK Attack Monsters*, a toy line of game pieces, display and collectible 3D artworks. He has a large offering of *Superfreeks* a super-hero spoof series. RAK is involved in several Comic Cons throughout the year, including San Diego Comic Con—"The Mother of all Comic Cons" —and several Wizard World Cons. He enjoys meeting and talking to his fans and will even host a *Dragon War* Game night at his home a few times a year. Visit www.rakgraphics.com to see all his work.





ABOUT THE SHOW

A global phenomenon that has wowed audiences for over 40 years, *Jesus Christ Superstar* is a timeless work set against the backdrop of an extraordinary and universally-known series of events but seen, unusually, through the eyes of Judas Iscariot.

Jesus Christ Superstar was the first musical by Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice to be produced for the professional stage and first came to major theatres when it debuted on Broadway in October 1971 at the Mark Hellinger Theatre in New York. Less than 12 months after the Broadway show opened, the rock spectacle went to London, exploding onto the West End at the Palace Theatre in August 1972 in a hugely successful production. By 1980, after 3,358 performances, Jesus Christ Superstar had become the longest-running musical in West End history at the time and grossed \$12.3 million. In all, Jesus Christ Superstar has grossed over \$205 million and has been professionally produced in 42 countries around the world!

ABOUT THE CREATORS

Composer Andrew Lloyd Webber was born on March 22, 1948, and grew up in South Kensington, England. His childhood was spent in a home filled with music and he demonstrated, from an early age, an extraordinary talent for it. He is the composer of many musicals, including Jesus Christ Superstar, Evita, Cats, Starlight Express, The Phantom of the Opera and Sunset Boulevard. Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom knighted him in 1992 as Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. He is the recipient of seven Tony Awards, three Grammys, one Oscar, an International Emmy and a Golden Globe. In 2006, he was named one of five of that year's Kennedy Center Honors recipients. Love Never Dies, a sequel to his Phantom of the Opera, opened in London in 2010. In 2011, he wrote the music for a new stage version of The Wizard of Oz. Originally starring

Michael Crawford (the original star of Broadway's Phantom of the Opera), the production opened in London in March 2011 and ran until September 2012 (followed thereafter by a production in Toronto and a U.S. tour). Last year, his newest show, School of Rock: The Musical, opened on Broadway in December 2015 (and is still playing to enthusiastic audiences at the Winter Garden Theatre). His foundation, the Andrew Lloyd Webber Music Program, is one of England's leading arts and education charities. Currently, nearly 3,000 children receive free musical instruments and music tuition throughout their school careers thanks to the foundation's gifts.

Lyricist Tim Rice was born in Buckinghamshire, England, on November 10, 1944. He entered the world of popular music as the lead singer of the pop-rock group the Aardvarks and went on to sing occasionally with other popular rock groups of the 1960s. He published his first song, "That's My Story," in 1965 - the same year he met his eventual musical partner, Andrew Lloyd Webber. In addition to Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, the two Englishmen collaborated on the blockbuster musicals *Iesus Christ Superstar* and *Evita*. Rice has worked with other notable composers, including Marvin Hamlisch and Paul McCartney, and received three Grammys for his work on Walt Disney's Aladdin. With Elton John, he wrote the lyrics for Disney's The Lion King. In 2010, he reunited with his Joseph...Dreamcoat collaborator Andrew Lloyd Webber to create new songs for a stage version of The Wizard of Oz. Originally starring Michael Crawford (the original star of Broadway's Phantom of the Opera), the production opened in London in March 2011 and ran until September 2012 (followed thereafter by a production in Toronto and a U.S. tour). His most recent project as a lyricist is a musical version of the World War II novel From Here to Eternity, which played in London's West End from October 2013 through March 2014.

I've always been drawn to *Jesus Christ Superstar*. As a musical that attempts a retelling of the last days of Jesus from Judas' point of view, it is a story that challenges our common perceptions. It's a courageous musical. For two thousand years, Judas has been Christianity's primary image of human evil. But in fact, very little is told in biblical texts about the life and history of Judas Iscariot.

In this theatrical rock opera, we are presented with the opportunity to try to understand Judas, his struggles with faith, fear and his understanding of the world around him. Tim Rice wrote, "We made him an everyman. Judas did not think of himself as a traitor. He did what he did, not because he was basically evil, but because he was intelligent. He could see Christ becoming something he considered harmful to the Jews. Judas felt they had been persecuted enough." He does not stand by impassively, but takes a stand for what he believes is the correct choice — despite his personal feelings. His decision to take action in difficult and complicated circumstances would, in many stories, be viewed as heroic.

I'm also fascinated by the role of the ensemble in Superstar. The ensemble portrays the roles of the apostles, the followers of Jesus, the residents of Jerusalem, roman soldiers, beggars, lepers — basically the entirety of humanity. To me, this sends a clear message that we are all a product of our environment and the 'accident of our births'. We could find ourselves on any side of an argument depending upon our life experiences.

All told, what I love about Jesus Christ Superstar is that it is great drama. It's a story of the human and divine experience, filled with passion, betrayal and death. It's a story about politics, policies, hard choices and sacrifice. It's a story about rejection and acceptance. And to top it all off, it's courageous, intelligent, insightful and a bit insolent. It's everything I love in a piece of theatre.
