A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members – Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch – and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 82nd Season.

The plot of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat comes from the Old Testament of the Bible in Genesis, Chapter 37: "Now Jacob loved Joseph more than all his children because he was the son of his old age; and he made him a coat of many colors. And when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all of them, they hated him and could not speak peaceably unto him." On a trip to Dotham, the brothers met a company of Ishmaelites on their way to Egypt. The jealous brothers saw an opportunity not to be missed: they stripped Joseph of his manycolored coat and sold him into slavery to the Ishmaelites. It may have been a case of good riddance for the brothers, but life is never what it seems (even in Biblical times!). Joseph, with his prophetic dreams, became a favorite of the Pharaoh and thus rose to political power. When famine struck, his brothers had to plead with Joseph for food, not recognizing him as their own brother.

ABOUT THE SHOW'S PERFORMANCE HISTORY

Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice wrote Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat in 1968 as an end-of-term concert at a small preparatory school in West London. The first version of the show had a running time of only 15 minutes. Eventually, over a period of several years in the late 1960s and early 1970s, composer Webber and lyricist Rice expanded their show from a simple "pop oratorio" to a full-length musical-theater favorite.

Since 1972, the show has had four major productions in London's West End theater district and two on Broadway in New

ABOUT THE MUSICAL — THE STORY York City — in addition to numerous national touring productions in the United Kingdom, the United States and in international locales.

> In 2007, the show became the focus of a BBC-TV reality show, Any Dream Will Do, in which a dozen young men competed (in the style of American Idol) to play the title role of Joseph in a new West End production (which opened in July of that year and ran in London for nearly two years).

> In 2014, a new U.S. national tour starring American Idol contestants and reallife husband-and-wife Diana DeGarmo and Ace Young - kicked off in Cleveland and played at theaters across America through 2015. Also in 2014, Elton John's production company, Rocket Pictures, announced that it had acquired the film rights to the musical and will develop the piece for an all-animated feature film. This film remains in a pre-production state, however, and a release date has not been announced.

> Weathervane Playhouse first produced Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat in 2000 and revived the show annually through 2014. After a one-year absence, this year's production marks the 16th time the show has been produced for the Weathervane stage.

> The show's licensing agent, the Rodgers & Hammerstein Organization, estimates that more than 20,000 productions have been staged over the years by schools and amateurtheater groups. Since 2000, audiences at Weathervane Playhouse in Akron have come to embrace this production as an annual holiday tradition perfect for children, their families and the young at heart.

ABOUT THE SHOW'S CREATORS

Composer ANDREW LLOYD WEBBER was born on March 22, 1948, and grew up in South Kensington, England. His childhood was spent in a home filled with music and he demonstrated, from an early age, an extraordinary talent for it. He is the composer of many musicals, including Jesus Christ Superstar, Evita, Cats, Starlight Express, The Phantom of the Opera and Sunset Boulevard. Queen Elizabeth II of the United Kingdom knighted him in 1992 as Sir Andrew Lloyd Webber. He is the recipient of seven Tony Awards, three Grammys, one Oscar, an International Emmy and a Golden Globe. In 2006, he was named one of five of that year's Kennedy Center Honors recipients. Love Never Dies, a sequel to his Phantom of the Opera, opened in London in 2010. In 2011, he wrote the music for a new stage version of The Wizard of Oz. Originally starring Michael Crawford (the original star of Broadway's Phantom of the Opera), the production opened in London in March 2011 and ran until September 2012 (followed thereafter by a production in Toronto and a U.S. tour). Last year, his newest show, School of Rock: The Musical, opened on Broadway (and is still playing to enthusiastic audiences at the Winter Garden Theatre). His foundation, the Andrew Lloyd Webber Music Program, is one of England's leading arts and education charities. Currently, nearly 3,000 children receive free musical instruments and music tuition throughout their school careers thanks to the foundation's gifts.

Lyricist TIM RICE was born in Buckinghamshire, England, on November 10, 1944. He entered the world of popular music as the lead singer of the pop-rock group the Aardvarks and went on to sing occasionally with other popular rock groups of the 1960s. He published his first song, "That's My Story," in 1965 — the same year he met his eventual musical partner, Andrew Lloyd Webber. In addition to Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, the two Englishmen collaborated on the blockbuster musicals Jesus Christ Superstar and Evita. Rice has worked with other notable composers, including Marvin Hamlisch and Paul McCartney, and received three Grammys for his work on Walt Disney's Aladdin. With Elton John, he wrote the lyrics for Disney's The Lion King. In 2010, he reunited with his Joseph...Dreamcoat collaborator Andrew Lloyd Webber to create new songs for a stage version of The Wizard of Oz. Originally starring Michael Crawford (the original star of Broadway's Phantom of the Opera), the production opened in London in March 2011 and ran until September 2012 (followed thereafter by a production in Toronto and a U.S. tour). His most recent project as a dyricist is a musical version of the World War II novel From Here to Eternity, which played in London's West End from October 2013 through March 2014.

The story of Joseph is about family and forgiveness. Since I came to Weathervane eleven seasons ago, for my family, it has been our family show. My husband and all three sons have participated in the show multiple years. We gauged our years around it. Who was Joe? Who was the narrator? Which brother did they play? So many other families share in this or other traditions in the Akron area. We are so blessed to be in a city with strong traditions and ties to each other.

For 15 consecutive seasons, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat was a staple and a tradition at Weathervane Playhouse. Last year, that had to come to a screeching halt when Weathervane could not obtain the rights to perform it, even with much pleading. This year brings the 16th year of Joseph... here. Whether this is your first or your sixteenth, I hope that you enjoy this story and Weathervane becomes your tradition with your family year after year.






