

Volunteer

Responsibilities

Here's a quick introduction to the responsibilities volunteers undertake to make our shows work. If you'd like to try your hand at any of these jobs, please call us. We'll help you learn! Volunteers with 100 hours or more of service are eligible for a special Weathervane membership!

- * Stage Management Duties include assisting the director throughout the rehearsal period, calling cues, keeping backstage safe and orderly and coordinating the technical needs of the show with the actors. A great opportunity for those who enjoy planning, communicating and taking charge. Once the director's work is done, it's the Stage Manager who runs each performance.
- ❖ Set Construction Use your building skills, carpentry or painting techniques to help make illusion come to life. Help is needed days and evenings.
- * Costumes Designers and workers are vital. We invite skilled and unskilled seamstresses to make or alter costumes, create patterns, care for costumes during a show and keep our wardrobe department organized.
- * Lighting Experience is a plus, but you can learn by assisting others who know computers and electrical requirements. We'll train eager volunteers to help hang, focus, and add color to lighting instruments. We'll also teach you how to run the light board and follow spots. Nobody can see the show without you.
- * Sound Create the music and sound effects tapes that enrich the aural envi-

- ronment for each show or add "live" backstage sound. Run the sound system for technical rehearsals and productions.
- * Properties All the items that help "dress" a set and all those used by actors in rehearsal and performance (from tea sandwiches to "deadly" weapons and "shattering" windowpanes) must be borrowed, built or cooked. Many volunteers are needed to work on each performance.
- * Office Volunteer If you enjoy dealing with the public, we can use your help during office hours and on show nights to assist in taking money and answering the phone to take reservations. You may also help with mailings, work with staff and greet customers and visitors.
- * Ushering Welcome audience members with your smile, show them to their seats, pass out programs and serve refreshments at intermission. Your help is always welcome.
- * House Manager This representative greets the audience, tears tickets and guides theater-goers to ushers for seating. You'll work with the stage manager to coordinate the timing of intermissions and remain in the lobby throughout the show to handle any emergency.

History

From the Barn to the Valley



From 1935 until 1951. Weathervane was housed in a modest carriage house barn on Marshall Avenue. Some recall its cramped quar-

ters but especially the energy and devotion of four ladies. Grace Hower Crawford, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch and Muriel MacLachlan, who believed that Akron deserved the best in theater and that volunteers could make it happen. A lobby plaque lists the names of other founders who shared their commitment. The rooftop weathervane gave the theater its name and logotype character, the Chanticleer.

In 1951, the organization renovated a building on Copley Road and, from 1960 - 1992, Bob Belfance served as director. Along with custodian/ticket office manager, Nora Scott, the two-person staff relied on volunteer support. Paid guest directors and children's theater instructors served in part-time positions. Ticket receipts and donations helped meet expenses and created a modest endowment. A fund-raising drive resulted in construction of the present 263-seat facility which opened in 1970. Thanks to Grace Crawford's legacy, the mortgage has been paid off.

Construction made possible by the most recent Capital Campaign added classrooms, rehearsal space, scene shop, additional prop storage, elevator, library, fly gallery and fly system, a sound-proof production booth and a costume workshop.

Weathervane celebrated its 500th Mainstage production, The Laramie Project, during the 2002-2003 season. Thanks for being a part of our history as we celebrate this 70th season!



In the John L. Dietz Theater

Once Weathervane had a theater to call its very own on Copley Road in the 1950's, the wish/need for another smaller "black box" theater surfaced. This space would provide a venue for meetings, children's activities, play readings, cabaret and small revues, and experimental productions, perhaps by local playwrights. A goal of the Capital Campaign which began in the year 2000 was to add new classrooms for the many children's programs being held by the theater. The Capital Campaign raised \$1,750,000 and provided a two-story addition to the playhouse; new classrooms became reality as well as installation of a fly system over the stage.

One of the classrooms sponsored by Margaret J. Dietz and named in memory of her 12-year-old son, John L. Dietz, became the "black box" theater so long awaited. John was a sixth grader at Akron's Rankin School at the time of his death in 1971 following an auto accident. A darling little boy with a passion, even at that age, for play-acting, he had just finished playing a clown in a youth theater production of Aesop's Falables, a rock musical for kids.

Angels in America: Millennium Approaches was the first full presentation held in Weathervane's "black box" theater from January 23 to February 5, 2005.



I am excited by the directing team that will join us for our 2005-2006 Season: Sarah Bailey, Nancy Cates, Martin Cespedes, Suzie Graham, Sarah May, Sean McConaha and Jessica Shepherd have found an artistic home at Weathervane and are eager to begin work on next season's grand entertainment. Larry Nehring, the Artistic Director of the Cleveland Shakespeare Festival who will direct *Much Ado About Nothing*, will join these veterans along with Kevin Joseph Kelly, artistic director of Rocky River Community Theater. Kevin, whom many of you may know as a performer in our CAN fundraisers, will join us to direct *The Sound of Music*. This combination of returning and new guest artists will renew our artistic spirit and keep our vision fresh.

Thank you for your support this past season. Your letters and comments (both supportive and critical) are vitally important as we make plans for the future. Season seventy was a challenging one but, as we look forward to next season's grand entertainment, I urge you -- come along and bring a boatload of friends, for this is only the beginning. Next season we are going to have lots of fun and you really don't want to miss out!

About Kathy & Mo

Kathy Najimy recently starred as the legendary Mae West in the Broadway play Dirty Blonde to great reviews. She currently provides the voice of "Peggy Hill" on the Emmy Award-winning Fox TV hit, King of the Hill, for which she received two Annie Award nominations. For three seasons she starred opposite Kirstie Alley as "Olive" on NBC's Veronica's Closet, for which she received an American Comedy Award nomination. Kathy is known internationally for her portrayal of "Sister Mary Patrick" in the blockbuster hit Sister Act, which won her an American Comedy Award for Funniest Supporting Actress and a nomination by the Hollywood Women's Press Club for Female Discovery of the Year. She recently performed on Broadway and in L.A. in The Vagina Monologues with Susan Sarandon, Glenn Close, Gloria Steinem, Whoopi Goldberg and Alanis Morrisette.

Kathy's film work includes a starring role in Hocus Pocus with Bette Midler, Hope Floats with Sandra Bullock, Zack and Reba opposite Debbie Reynolds and Sister Act II, for which she received an American Comedy Award nomination. She had cameo appearances in *The Wedding Planner* with Jennifer Lopez, *Jeffrey* and The Big K. She sang and danced as Elmo's stepmother on Fox's TV special Cinderelmo, and also sang and danced her way through the opening number of the 1995 Academy Awards.

For her 15 years of AIDS activism, Kathy has been honored with the L.A. Shanti's Founder Award as well as the L.A. Gay and Lesbian Center's Distinguished Achievement Award. She is an enthusiastic supporter of women and animal rights and has lent her support to a variety of worthy organizations including Broadway Cares-Equity Fights AIDS, Planned Parenthood and the Human Rights Campaign Fund. She resides in Los Angeles and New York with her husband, Dan Finnerty, and their daughter Samia.

Mo Gaffney gained national attention when she wrote and starred, with Kathy Najimy, in the Off-Broadway comedy sensation, The Kathy and Mo Show: Parallel Lives. Her critically acclaimed performance earned her an OBIE Award. After the show ended its sold-out engagement, HBO taped the comedy and aired it as an hour-long special which went on to win two CableACE Awards, "Best Comedy Special" and "Best Performance in a Comedy Special."



Youth Education

Weathervane offers professionally taught classes in acting, stagecraft, musical theatre and improvisation for children up to age 18. Fall and spring classes are held on Saturdays and two-week Hands on Theater (H.O.T.) workshops are planned throughout the summer. The cost is minimal with a limited number of scholarships available and discounted fees for Weathervane members.

Children may also audition for roles in many productions. Casting is not dependent upon class enrollment. Participation is an extension of valuable training in every facet of production from the audition process to technical and performance experience. Family members may also have learning opportunities by participating in such productions.

Weathervane works with area schools by providing outreach information and study guides as part of our Project STAGE program, which brings public and private school students to see as many as five productions each season. In the 2005-2006 season, *Much Ado About Nothing, Crowns*

Adult Classes

Professionally taught Adult Theatre classes include Classical Drama, Improvisation, Scenic Design, Stage Lighting and Directing. These classes help actors expand their performance and public speaking skills. Look for classes in the spring.

Classes meet at the Playhouse and are subject to minimum enrollment numbers. Tuition costs range from \$135 - \$300. Classes are for children ages 4 through 18. You will find a complete list of classes and times in our education brochure available in the lobby.
