A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild,


The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951, the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 80th Season.







Quilts for the 21st Century by Çarole Pollard

Quilting has always fascinated me. In centuries past, the making of quilts was a necessity that also embodied artistic expression. In the 19th and early 20th century, as the pioneers made their way across the country, quilts, and the creation of them, were of utmost importance. The quilts provided much needed warmth and the making of them brought women together, forging bonds of friendship and community. Today, they are more likely to be the medium for the artist's creative statements. To me, Carole Pollard's work is an extension and exploration of the techniques and subject matter of the quilts that were made during those pioneer years when the story of *Oklahoma!* takes place.

Carole Pollard always loved art and entered KSU in 1957 intending to major in art and English. Despite her love of art, she realized that the greater promise of success lay with English. So, Carole set aside art to concentrate on English. She earned B.A., M.A., and Ph.D. degrees in English. During her doctoral studies, she decided that she wanted to work where business, industry and education met and where students could lift themselves and change their lives. Having set aside literature, she taught at Stark State College's Communicative Skills (now English) Department focusing on Technical Writing from 1975 to 2000. Now, in retirement, she has returned to both art and literature discovering that the literature she studied for so many years can inspire the art she intends to make for the rest of her years.

The artist explains: Art is the love of my life. I began quilting in 1995 with a desire merely to create beautiful things using curved two-patch piecing. The consistency and predictability of the method's design, however, became somewhat boring, and I now find myself groping towards greater significance. I have no desire to do confrontative political work and have discovered that I don't do 'ugly' which often masquerades as 'modern art.' The 'Aha!' was that my degrees in literature have given me a portal into a realm where verbal images can be expressed as visual art. Each piece represents a segment of my life's time, and life is too short to do indifferent work. Thus, I approach each piece with intensity and passion.

I hope you will enjoy Carole's artistic vision in this exhibit.

About the Play and Playwright

About the Play

A groundbreaking masterpiece that launched the golden age of the Broadway musical, Oklahoma! spins the tale of the high-spirited rivalry between the local farmers and cowboys in the Indian territory of Oklahoma at the turn of the twentieth century. This provides a colorful background against which Curly, a handsome cowboy, and Laurey, a winsome farm girl, play out their love story.

Considered a revolutionary show in its 1943 debut, Oklahoma! challenged theatrical boundaries, traditions and conventions. The show was the first to introduce a "dream ballet," in which a character's inner thoughts are expressed through an extended dance sequence. And because the musical's song lyrics were written before the music, the show became one of the first musicals in which the songs drove the dramatic action of the play.

In so doing, composer Richard Rodgers and lyricist Oscar Hammerstein II chose a notable departure from the popular musical plays and operettas of their day, in which songs were often just "dropped in" between plot-driving scenes of dialogue and action. Oklahoma! is often cited by theater historians and literary critics as the first "book musical" -- meaning the show's songs and dances are fully integrated into a well-made story with serious dramatic goals that is able to evoke genuine emotions other than laughter.

Featuring such unforgettable songs as The Surrey with the Fringe on Top, Oh, What a Beautiful Mornin', Kansas City, I Cain't Say No and the show's stirring title song, Oklahoma!, which celebrates young love, the enduring spirit of American optimism and the triumph of hope over pessimism.

Production History

Oklahoma! launched a new era in the American musical and was the beginning of the most successful songwriting partnership in Broadway history. The show opened at the St. James Theatre on Broadway on March 31, 1943. At that time, the longest-running show in Broadway history had run for three years. Oklahoma! surpassed that record by two more years, running for a marathon 2,212 performances before closing on May 29, 1948. The national tour played across the United States for an unprecedented 10-1/2 years, visiting every single state, and playing before a combined audience of more than 10 million people. In 1947, Oklahoma! opened at the Theatre Royal on Drury Lane in London, where it ran for 1,548 performances, the longest run of any show up to that time in the 267-year history of the theatre. In 1953, the Oklahoma State Legislature named Oklahoma! the official state song. In 1955, the motion picture version of Oklahoma!, starring Gordon MacRae and Shirley Jones and produced by Rodgers and Hammerstein, was released to great success. Broadway has seen four revivals of the musical (in 1951, 1953, 1979 and 2002).

About the Creators

Composer RICHARD RODGERS' (1902-1979) contributions to the musical theatre of his day were extraordinary, and his influence on the musical theatre of today and tomorrow remains legendary. His career spanned more than six decades, his hits ranging from the silver screens of Hollywood to the bright lights of Broadway, London and beyond. A recipient of countless awards, he wrote more than 900 published songs and 40 Broadway musicals. His first collaborator was Lorenz Hart (1895-1943) with whom he wrote more than 15 musical comedies.

OSCAR HAMMERSTEIN II (lyrics and book) (1895-1960) His father, William, was a theatre manager and for many years director of Hammerstein's Victoria, the most popular vaudeville theatre of its day. His uncle, Arthur Hammerstein, was a successful Broadway producer and his grandfather, Oscar Hammerstein, a famous opera impresario.

The Rodgers and Hammerstein musical collaborations included Carousel, Allegro, South Pacific, The King and I, Me and Juliet, Pipe Dream, Flower Drum Song and The Sound of Music. Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote one musical specifically for the big screen (State Fair) and one for television (Cinderella). Collectively, their musicals have garnered dozens of awards including numerous Pulitzer Prizes, Tonys, Oscars, Emmys and Grammys.

After Hammerstein's death in 1960, Rodgers continued to write for the musical stage, including No Strings, and collaborations with Martin Charnin, Stephen Sondheim and Sheldon Harnick. His fortieth, and final, Broadway musical, I Remember Mama opened on Broadway less than eight months before his death on Dec. 30, 1979.

MELANIE YC PEPE, Artistic Director, holds a B.F.A. degree in Theatrical Performance and Management from Kent State University, where she is currently serving on the School of Theatre and Dance Advisory Board. She is currently working on her graduate certificate at Cornell University. At Weathervane, she has produced more than 35 theatrical productions. In her career, she has acted, directed and designed in more than 50 theatrical productions and two independent films. She also designed for the Master's medical training program at Northeast Ohio Medical University, Melanie served as Director of Education and Producer of the Emerging Artist Series from 2005 to 2015 and was recognized by the Weathervane Board in 2011 with the Trustees Award. During her years as Director of Education and Producer of the Emerging Artist Series, participation in Weathervane's Education programs grew by 411% and participation in the EAS productions by 375%. She believes strongly in vitalizing the love of theatre in our communities. She lives in West Akron with her husband Christopher Pepe and their children, Calista, Zavier and Jude.

Director's Notes

Oklahoma! revolutionized musical theatre. Never before had a musical seamlessly combined lyric melodies with innovative dances that were both beautiful and integral to the story. As a child, I would sit in my room and listen to my record and simply dance around the room. I am delighted to direct Weathervane Playhouse's 578th production.

The Music: Richard Rodgers began his musical career working with Lorenz Hart. Although they wrote many hit musicals together, Hart was a difficult partner -- he was unreliable and often drunk. Rodgers approached Oscar Hammerstein II in 1942, to work with him on an adaptation of Lynn Riggs' *Green Grow the Lilacs*. The two men believed in "integrated musicals" in which the music and dance advanced the storyline. The music contains both narrative action in *The Surrey with the Fringe on Top* and romantic lyricism in *People Will Say We're in Love*. Listening to Richard Rodgers' music is like listening to the emotions of the characters. When words are not enough, melodies help express the inexpressible.

The Dance: Like Rodgers and Hammerstein, choreographer Agnes de Mille was a pioneer in her field. She had just choreographed Aaron Copland's *Rodeo* and was delighted to be asked to collaborate on *Oklahoma!* De Mille brought the dream ballet down to earth. She incorporated humor and truth while creating an emotional arc for the character of Laurey. The audience is transported into the dreams of a girl who is unsure of her future. In this sequence, her dreams turn into nightmares. Our choreography stays close to the original work by de Mille, and costume designer Jasen Smith incorporates an innovative design for the characters' dream sequence costumes. The other dances in the show are also true to the characters in *Oklahoma!* and to much of de Mille's original work. Although I have chosen to modify and change the actual steps, much of the style remains. De Mille was part of the creative process of the work and I found it important to honor her vision in the piece.

The Story: "We know we belong to the land and the land we belong to is grand." From the opening strains, we are transported to the Oklahoma Territory in 1906. Oklahoma is on the verge of becoming a state and the characters in the show are growing up and maturing. Each character must come to grips with his or her own desires. Laurey must decide where her future lies; Curly and Will remain constant in their quests for love and Jud is overcome by his desires which eventually drive him over the edge.

The Legacy: In 1943, America was reeling from the batterings that Japan and Germany dealt in World War II. Mary Rodgers spoke of the opening of *Oklahoma!* She remembered being in New York as soldiers stood shoulder to shoulder in packed houses, longing to connect to the America they were fighting for. This musical provides us all with hope during our dark days. A trip to the theater can be your escape into a world filled with love, comedy and joy. Sit back and enjoy our scenic design by Alan Scott Ferrall, intended to transport you to the farmstead and to allow for seamless, open scene changes.






