

A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935 the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan with the other founders offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938 a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. It, too, continues to this day.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1471 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-69 and from 1974-92. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned. During the 1960s the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed; these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was just completed for the opening of the 75th season.

We are proud to open our adult season with this production of the winner of the 2008 Pulitzer Prize for Drama and Tony Award for Best Play, *August: Osage County.* We hope you enjoy this major new theatrical work that unflinchingly exposes the dark side of the Midwestern American family. We follow this dynamic opener next month with the rousing interactive musical

Our Young Actor Series will present *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* in December, and then arguably one of the greatest plays ever written, *Our Town*, in March 2013.

These theatrical works represent a few of the stories of our lives. From all of us here at Weathervane, I look forward to welcoming you back to share what they have to say about our collective human experience.

About the Play and Playwright

August: Osage County is about a father who vanishes...a pill-popping mother caught in the grip of addiction...three sisters with all kinds of secrets...a Midwestern American family approaching a total meltdown, confronting unspoken truths and revealing dark secrets. One of the most bracing and critically acclaimed plays in recent Broadway history, August: Osage County is a blistering portrait of the modern dysfunctional American family at its finest -- and absolute worst.

Beverly Weston is the hard-drinking patriarch of the Weston clan who disappears one hot summer night. Unsure whether he is dead or just missing, his extended family reunites at the rural Oklahoma homestead, where long-held secrets are unflinchingly and uproariously revealed.

The fractured, multi-generational Weston clan must also deal with the deeply unstable Violet Weston, the sharp-tongued, drug-addicted matriarch who stands at the center of this domestic storm.

Grand, gripping, blisteringly honest, bitingly funny -- and yet sensationally entertaining -- *August: Osage County* reveals a family full of unforgettable characters who are forced to lock horns with uncomfortable truths.

August: Osage County originated at Chicago's famed Steppenwolf Theatre Company, where playwright Tracey Letts is a member of the theatre's artistic ensemble. Following the show's highly successful 2007 premiere at Steppenwolf, the show transferred later that year to Broadway, where it ran for 648 performances before closing on June 28, 2009. Among its many awards, August: Osage County won the 2008 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, the 2008 Tony Award for Best Play and the 2008 Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Play. The play also enjoyed a successful run at London's National Theatre and a 40-week tour across the United States (with Oscarwinner Estelle Parsons commanding the stage as Violet Weston). A motion-picture adaptation of August: Osage County is slated to begin filming this month (on location in Oklahoma) with a cast featuring Meryl Streep as Violet and Julia Roberts as Barbara.

About the Playwright

TRACY LETTS is an actor and playwright who has been a member of Chicago's Steppenwolf Theatre Company artistic ensemble since 2002, where he has acted in such productions as Betrayal, The Pillowman, Last of the Boys, The Pain and the Itch, The Dresser, Homebody/Kabul, The Dazzle, Glengarry Glen Ross (which also traveled to Dublin and Toronto), Three Days of Rain, Road to Nirvana, Picasso at the Lapin Agile and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?

In addition to his Pulitzer Prize- and Tony Award-winning August: Osage County, his other plays include Man From Nebraska (Pulitzer Prize finalist), Bug, Killer Joe and Superior Donuts. Most recently, he wrote a new adaptation of Anton Chekhov's Three Sisters, which Steppenwolf produced this summer. His screenplay credits include Bug, Killer Joe and the forthcoming movie adaptation of August: Osage County.

As an actor, his television credits include roles on *Prison Break* and *The District* (CBS), *Profiler* (NBC), *The Drew Carey Show* (ABC), *Seinfeld* (NBC) and *Home Improvement* (ABC). His film credits include *Guinevere*, *Chicago Cab*, *U.S. Marshals*, *Straight Talk* and *Paramedics*.

For his next project, Letts and his fellow Steppenwolf ensemble member Amy Morton will this fall headline the new Broadway revival of *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?* The two performers starred in the same show at Steppenwolf in 2010 and 2011.

In the Harris Family Gallery - Valerie Evans & Claire Heldman

In the current production of *August: Osage County*, there is a character named Johnna Monevata who is a Native American. She is one of the more calm and rational people in this play. Because of her presence in this production, artwork by two local Native American women is being exhibited in The Harris Family Gallery.

Valerie Evans, whose portrait subjects are a reflection of her Native American heritage (Delaware/Six Nations) has been interested in drawing and painting since her childhood. She began experimenting with colored pencil when her children were young as it was a medium that allowed her to "drop whatever I was doing at a moment's notice to attend to their immediate needs." Valerie says, "The same painterly effects of oil painting can be achieved through burnishing and applying multiple layers of pencil." In her work she tries to achieve an underlying effect of quiet reverence and dignity.

Valerie, who works for the American Indian Education Center in Parma, had the unique opportunity of exhibiting and selling her work at the Cleveland Museum of Art in the gift shop, during the "Art of the Americas" exhibit in 2010. In November of 2011, the same Native portraits were exhibited at Cleveland State University. She will also do commissioned portraits.

Claire Heldman ('Oyate Wakkan Wia'-The People See Her Woman) is a member of the Lakota from the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe of Eagle Butte, South Dakota. She is past President of the North American Indian Cultural Center (Akron). Claire has been working in the arts for more than 20 years and has exhibited extensively in Northeast Ohio, South Dakota, New Mexico, Colorado, Louisiana and Florida.

In 1997, she was one of 100 artists (from a group of 500) selected by the Mattie Kelly Foundation of the Fine Arts to exhibit in the Fine Arts Festival in Destin, Florida. In 2004, Claire received a nomination for "Artist of the Year" from the Ohio Arts Council. One of her pieces hangs in its Multi-Cultural Gallery in Columbus.

Currently, Claire is working with The University of Akron's Myers School of Art and the Department of Anthropology & Classic Studies. She is a consultant helping to identify artifacts from 600 AD thru the early 1900s as to the locations and dates made. There is a two part exhibition, "Native American Ethnographic Exhibition from The Jim and Vanita Oelschlager Collection," currently on display until Oct. 14 at UA's Center for the History of Psychology. This exhibit featured the Southwestern and Alaskan tribes. A second exhibit is planned for 2013 that will focus on Great Northern Plains Natives with an opening and reception at the Perkins Mansion.

Much of her work employs a variety of media incorporating slate, horsehide, driftwood, feathers, horse hair and canvas into visions of her heritage. Much of her work is visualized through meditation and prayer. "I endeavor to bridge cultures through art with the hope of bringing a better understanding of individuality among all races," says Claire.
