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
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



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A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They names their space "weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild,

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951, the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees, Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season.

About the Production

Weathervane Playhouse celebrates the 75th anniversary of one of America's most enduring cinematic treasures -- The Wizard of Oz -- by presenting a faithful stage adaptation of the beloved film. Complete with all the familiar songs and iconic characters, The Wizard of Oz on stage continues to demonstrate the powerful magnetism of this truly American fairy tale.

Although the now-famous film was not an instant box office success in 1939, succeeding generations have enshrined the movie s treasured place in the hearts and minds of the young and the young at heart. The film was, up to that time, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer s most expensive production and, despite largely positive reviews, initial ticket sales failed to recoup the studio s expenses.

The 1939 film is often ranked among the top 10 best movies of all time in various critics' and popular polls, and is the source of many memorable quotes referenced in modern popular culture.

ABOUT THE SHOW S CREATORS

HAROLD ARLEN (music and lyrics) was an American composer of popular music. He was born Hyman Arluck, in Buffalo, New York, on Feb. 15, 1905, the child of a Jewish cantor. He learned the piano as a youth and formed a band as a young man. He achieved some local success as a pianist and singer and moved to New York City in his early 20s. At this point, he changed his name to Harold Arlen. He performed on record with the "Buffalodians" orchestra, as well as those of Red Nichols, Henny Hendrickson and Arnold Johnson.

In 1929, Arlen composed his first well-known song: "Get Happy" (with lyrics by Ted Koehler). Throughout the early and mid-1930s, Arlen and Koehler wrote shows for the Cotton Club, a popular Harlem night club, as well as Broadway musicals and Hollywood films. Arlen also continued to perform with some success, most notably on records with Leo Reisman's society dance orchestra.

Arlen and Koehler wrote many hit songs during the early and mid-1930s including "Between the Devil and the Deep Blue Sea," "I Love a Parade," "I've Got the World on a String," "I've Got a Right to Sing the Blues," "It's Only a Paper Moon," "Let's Fall in Love," "Ill Wind" and "Stormy Weather."

In the mid-1930s, Arlen married, and spent increasingly more time in California, writing for movie musicals. It was at this time that he began working with lyricist Yip Harburg. In 1938, the team was hired by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer to compose songs for *The Wizard of Oz.*

E. Y. (YIP) HARBURG (music and lyrics), often known as "Broadway's social conscience," was born on April 8, 1896 of Russian-Jewish immigrant parents, raised in poverty on Manhattan's Lower East Side, and later attended City College of New York, where he struck up a lifelong friendship with his classmate, Ira Gershwin. Yip was a master lyricist, poet and bookwriter who was dedicated to social justice.

On Broadway, Harburg began writing lyrics for multiple revues in the 1930s which included songs that became standards including "Brother, Can You Spare a Dime?," the classic anthem of the Depression (co-written with composer Jay Gorney in 1932) and "April in Paris" (co-written with Vernon Duke in 1932). He co-wrote the book (with Fred Saidy) and wrote the lyrics for *Finian's Rainbow* (1947, music by Burton Lane) which won the Henderson and George Jean Nathan Awards for Best Musical Comedy, for *Flahooley* (1951, music by Sammy Fain).

In Hollywood, Harburg wrote lyrics for numerous film musicals during the 1930s and 1940s. His most famous work was *The Wizard of Oz* (1939, with Arlen). Altogether, Yip wrote the lyrics to over 600 songs with a variety of composers. "It's Only a Paper Moon" (1932, with Arlen), "Over the Rainbow" (1939, Arlen, which won the Academy Award), "We're Off to See the Wizard," "Ding Dong! The Witch Is Dead" and "Happiness Is Just a Thing Called Joe" (1943, Arlen, from the film *Cabin in the Sky*). Later, with Lane, he wrote "Old Devil Moon" and "How Are Things in Glocca Morra?" The team of Arlen and Harburg also wrote Groucho Marx's signature song, "Lydia, the Tattooed Lady" (1939, from *At the Circus*). He died on March 5, 1981 at 84 years young.

JOHN KANE (adapter) is a British actor and writer who was born on Oct. 27, 1945. An associate actor with the Royal Shakespeare Company (RSC), he played Puck in Peter Brook's acclaimed production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* alongside Ben Kingsley, Alan Howard and Frances de la Tour, before turning to comedy script writing. His TV acting credits include the mentally-crippled Tommy in the 1974 Doctor Who serial *Planet of the Spiders*.

Continuing to work às an actor with the RSC, he also created the British TV sitcoms Me and My Girl (1984-1988) with Richard O'Sullivan and Tim Brooke-Taylor, All in Good Faith (1985-1988) with Richard Briers, and the TV drama The Feathered Serpent (1976-1978). He also wrote for, among others, Never the Twain, Smuggler, Rings on Their Fingers, and wrote the "Six Napoleons" episode of The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes, with Jeremy Brett in the title role.

Turning to the stage, he wrote the RSC's adaptation of *The Wizard of Oz*, the West End Cole Porter tribute *A Swell Party* and the words and music in 2005 for *The Canterville Ghost* at the Southwark Playhouse. He also wrote the TV film *The Vamp* starring Shelley Winters, the children's cartoon Britt Allcroft's Magic Adventures of Mumfie, and won a CableACE Award for his screenplay for *Daisies in December* starring Joss Ackland. He collaborated with composer David Bass on a children's opera, *Kids Court*, which was premiered in Cambridge, Massachusetts in 2007 by the North Cambridge Family Opera Company. He continues to work as a stage and screen actor.

About Our Directing Team



SARAH ELAINE BAILEY (Director and Choreographer) this past fall celebrated her 11th consecutive year as the director of Weathervane's annual Young Actor Series production of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*. Last summer, she also directed and choreographed *Honk!* and *The Music Man*. Her other Weathervane directorial credits include 2012 s *Annie*, 2011 s *Rodgers and Hammerstein s Cinderella*, 2010 s *Seussical*, 2009 s *Madeline and the Gypsies*, 2008 s *Go, Dog. Go!* and 2006 s *Madeline s Rescue*. As a performer on the Weathervane stage, she played Trix (the aviatrix) in *The Drowsy Chaperone*. Her other Weathervane performance credits include Sister

Margaretta in 2006 s *The Sound of Music* and Sister Amnesia in 2004 s *Nunsense* (for which she won a Chanticleer Award). She has taught Weathervane youth-theater classes for nearly a decade and she is a frequent performer with The Not-Ready-for-Mainstage Players at the Playhouse s annual Chanticleer Awards ceremony. Since September 2010, as Weathervane s Education Outreach Coordinator, she has also assisted the Playhouse s education department in coordinating the hiring and training of the many teachers who staff the Playhouse s participation in Akron After School (on-site, after-school theater-education classes at dozens of Akron Public Schools facilities). She received her bachelor s degree in music from Ohio Northern University and her master s degree in music and pedagogy from Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. She has sung at Carnegie Hall with the New York Philharmonic and was a grand finalist in Guangdong, China, International Vocal Competition and has also performed at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in Scotland. Her favorite roles include Adele in *Die Fledermaus*, Juliette in *Romeo and Juliette* and a Cherubino in *Le Nozze de Figaro*. Her grandest roles, however, remain mother to three daughters -- Isabelle, Sophia and Cecilia -- and wife to husband Kyle, with whom she makes her home in Cuyahoga Falls.



DANE C.T. LEASURE (Assistant Director) is excited to be back working at Weathervane Playhouse. Last summer he served as Assistant Director for *Honk!* He has performed and directed around Northeast Ohio and in Virginia, where he completed his M.F.A. degree in Shakespeare and performance. Some of his favorite directing credits include *A Midsummer Night's Dream, Much Ado About Nothing* and *Jacob Marley's Christmas Carol*. He is the Producing Artistic Director of the Rubber City Shakespeare Company.
