

A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works -- even opera -- with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild,


The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951, the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 80th Season.







Welcome to Weathervane!

From the Managing Director LISA MANSFIELD



Peter Pan was the first musical I ever saw brought to life. I had seen movie musicals on late night television and had even done a high school musical or two. But during my junior year, a friend

and her family took me to Goodyear Community Theater during some of the final dress rehearsals of *Peter Pan*.

I had listened to and memorized dozens of musicals from the albums by that time and they created beautiful pictures in my head, but this was real and right before my eyes. Everything was so visceral - the sound of the orchestra warming up, the smells of make-up, saw dust and a bit of sweat backstage, the lights and faces of excited people. I was literally hooked... pun intended. I helped backstage to set props for the run of the show and I think I ushered every single performance. Come to find out so many years later that several Weathervaners such as Ian Haberman, Jack Steele, Kevin Lambes and maybe some of you were involved in that same production.

The fact that it is the first show in my first season as Managing Director at Weathervane Playhouse has made me pause in the past few weeks and be thankful for the huge circle that life seems to have given me with these two firsts. It is my hope that our audience contains not only people who share my love of this show, but also theatergoers experiencing this classic musical as their very first show. No matter whether you are here for your first or your hundredth theatrical experience, may *Peter Pan* Inspire an everlasting love of theatre in all of us!

What was your first show?

From the Artistic Director MELANIE YC PEPE

The world of theatre is make-believe. We make houses out of scraps of wood, curtains out of bed sheets and tablecloths and Neverland out of colors, lights, sounds and lots of imagination. With our fairy dust we invite our audiences to come with us through the open window and journey to another world. The stage is a beautiful place for this story to live and breathe!



Peter Pan is about a boy who lives world filled with fairies, pirates and mermaids. He lives with a pack of boys who will follow him anywhere as they share in endless adventures. A boy

who lives each moment of his life to the fullest. A boy who is afraid that growing up will take away his sense of magic and adventure.

Despite Peter's concerns, he is drawn to Wendy, who has no qualms about growing up. Peter brings her to Neverland, where she can stay and play and never grow up, but she eventually decides to return home and continue her journey to adulthood. In the real world, growing up is inevitable. But does it have to be what Peter thinks it is?

Ultimately, *Peter Pan* is a story about choices, about becoming boring or remaining adventurous, about living in the moment or choosing to consider consequences. If you could chose to remain a child forever, would you really?








The History Panels created by Alan Scott Ferrall



The history panels were created six years ago to celebrate Weathervane's 75th year of continuous operation. Weathervane is now celebrating its 81st anniversary. The panels depict different chapters of the Weathervane story, representing who we were and the journey that brought us to where we are today. They illustrate:

The Founders There would be no Weathervane without our Four Founders, each of whom brought her own set of skills to the project.

The Buildings in which we performed are very much a part of who we are, just as much as the people who filled them with their talents in drama and music.

Women's Board, which had its origins in service to the theatre. The Women's Board has now become The Volunteer Guild, which continues to provide service to Weathervane in many ways.

Education, which, of course, was at the forefront in the minds of our Founders. This continues to be an important aspect of Weathervane's mission.

A Life in the Theater These panels honor those volunteers who started their acting careers at the beginning of Weathervane's existence – from the Marshall Avenue Barn through the Copley Road years and who also spent significant time at the new building here at Weathervane Lane. Robert and Florence Beard, Margaret McKinley Moore, and Noble S. "Jim" Elderkin were all charter members of Weathervane.







About the Play

About the Show and Its History

Peter Pan is a musical adaptation of Sir J.M. Barrie's 1904 play Peter Pan, or The Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up. The immense success of Barrie's play prompted various amounts of adaptation on the story, including other plays. In the 1950s, Edwin Lester, the founder and director of the Los Angeles Civic Light Opera at the time, had obtained the American rights to the work and planned to produce an adaptation that added music for Mary Martin.

Directed by Jerome Robbins and with original music by Mark "Moose" Charlap and lyrics by Carolyn Leigh, the adaptation had a pre-Broadway tour across the West Coast that was not terribly well received. As a result, Robbins hired lyricists Betty Comden and Adolph Green along with composer Jule Styne to write several new songs, effectively turning the show into a full-scale musical.

Peter Pan opened at the Winter Garden Theatre on Broadway on Oct. 20, 1954. Starring Mary Martin and Cyril Ritchard, the show's producer planned for a limited run of performances, having previously made a deal with NBC to air the show on television. The Broadway production closed on Feb. 26, 1955, and was followed by NBC's Producers' Showcase broadcast on March 7, 1955. The initial broadcast of the musical attracted a huge audience of 65 million viewers.

After the immense popularity from the television broadcast, the musical found a new home on Broadway through several revivals. The first came in 1979 at the Lunt-Fontanne Theatre. Another production came in 1990 starring Cathy Rigby. Two more revivals launched in 1998 and 1999 and numerous national tours.

Last December, a new generation rediscovered this classic American musical when NBC aired a live broadcast featuring Allison Williams in the title role.

About the Show and Its Creators

Lyricist **CAROLYN LEIGH** was born in New York City on Aug. 21, 1926. After attending Queens College in New York City, she worked as a copyrighter for radio stations and advertising agencies. Collaborating with composers such as Cy Coleman and "Moose" Charlap, Leigh also wrote the Broadway stage scores for *Peter Pan, Wildcat* and *Little Me*. Leigh also contributed to the film scores of *The Cardinal* and *Father Goose*.

Composer **MORRIS "MOOSE" CHARLAP** was born in Philadelphia on Dec. 19, 1928. Though he composed songs for several Broadway shows, he remains best known for *Peter Pan*. He was educated at the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Wisconsin and the Philadelphia Conservatory of Music. He also is listed as the composer for the 1969 TV movie musical *Hans Brinker*, which starred Eleanor Parker (though her singing voice was that of Charlap's wife, Sandy Stewart).

The team of **BETTY COMDEN and ADOLPH GREEN** (additional lyrics) — the 1991 recipients of the Kennedy Center Honors, and the longest running creative partnership in theatre history — began writing and performing their own satirical comic material in the late 1930s in a group called The Revuers, which included the late Judy Holliday. Comden and Green went on to collaborate with Leonard Bernstein and Jerome Robbins on what was the first show for all of them, *On the Town*.

Also with Bernstein they collaborated on the score for Wonderful Town. They also wrote the book for Applause, the book and lyrics for On the Twentieth Century and the lyrics for The Will Rogers Follies (with Cy Coleman) and A Doll's Life. Applause, Wonderful Town, On the Twentieth Century, The Will Rogers Follies and Hallelujah, Baby! won them six Tony Awards. Their many film musicals include Singin' in the Rain, The Band Wagon, On the Town, It's Always Fair Weather. Two of these screen musicals, The Band Wagon and It's Always Fair Weather, received Academy Award nominations and, along with On The Town, won the Screenwriters Guild of America Award.

JULE STYNE (additional music) made Broadway sing for 50 years before his death in 1994. In addition to Peter Pan, he composed the music for such shows as High Button Shoes, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes, Two on the Aisle, Hazel Flagg, Gypsy, Bells Are Ringing, Do Re Mi, Subways Are for Sleeping, Funny Girl, Fade Out — Fade In, The Red Shoes, Darling of the Day, Lorelei and Sugar. Over his lengthy career, his musical achievements were honored by such organizations as the Songwriters Hall of Fame and the American Theater Hall of Fame. He was a 1990 recipient of the Kennedy Center Honors, the winner of two Grammys and an Oscar winner for "Three Coins in the Fountain."
