From Our Executive Director

Setting the Stage for the Future

(Below are excerpts from John Hedges' remarks at Akron Mayor Don Plusquellic's press conference on August 6, 2008 announcing Weathervane's Capital Campaign – Setting the Stage for the Future)

Today, we are announcing an initiative that will boldly move Weathervane Playhouse into the future and signal the beginning of a dynamic new era in this theater's long and distinguished history.

We are announcing a nearly \$1 million Capital Expansion and Renovation Project designed to better enable this organization to fulfill its strategic objectives as we move into the next stage of Weathervane's growth and development.

This initiative is a direct outgrowth of our desire to make a significant contribution to Akron, Ohio artistically and economically, as well as to be a leader in the education and development of our most precious resource – our young people. It is an important part of our planning and an integral element to our future viability as we chart the course for the next 75 years. In conceiving this project we have taken inspiration from our leaders as well as from other organizations in our community that are putting Akron 'on the map.' We have been inspired by the notion that Akron is a place for innovation by projects like the dynamic expansion of The University of Akron, Canal Park, Lock 3, the amazing Akron Art Museum and many others that are all making a contribution. We look to join them.

What this project really reflects is matching physically the design of this building with the vibrancy of human expression that we foster and support here inside this building on a daily basis.

In our season brochure we assert that Life is Believing. This newly renovated and expanded facility will stand as testament to the power of belief -- the belief that our founders had 73 years ago to begin such an enterprise, the belief of the visionaries who purchased this land and built this theater nearly 40 years ago and the belief of the community leaders who came together to expand this building and increase our theater producing capabilities eight years ago. We look to harness that same spirit of belief once again in order that we may step up and make a contribution to Akron, Ohio.

About the Play and Playwright

Weathervane Playhouse first produced *The Rainmaker* during the 1955-1956 season (in its former Copley Road facility) in a production directed by Bill VanNostran.

The Rainmaker's New York premiere was at New York's Cort Theatre on Oct. 28, 1954. The original Broadway cast featured four-time Tony nominee and Oscar-winner Geraldine Page as Lizzie and a young Darren McGavin as Starbuck (decades before filming what would become perhaps his most familiar role: the hapless father in A Christmas Story, portions of which were filmed in Cleveland). In its Broadway outing, The Rainmaker ran for 125 performances, closing on Feb. 12, 1955. The show then crossed the Atlantic, with Page remaining as Lizzie, and opened in London in May 1956, where its box office take doubled that of its New York run.

Hollywood soon came calling and playwright Nash adapted his own script for the 1956 film adaptation, which starred Katherine Hepburn and Burt Lancaster and received two Oscar nominations (for Hepburn and composer Alex North's score). A 1982 made-for-TV adaptation (again penned by its playwright) starred Tuesday Weld and Tommy Lee Jones. New York's Roundabout Theatre Company revived the play on Broadway in a 1999 production whose Starbuck was played by Woody Harrelson (of the classic NBC-TV series *Cheers*); it played for 74 performances and earned Jayne Atkinson a Tony Award nomination for her portrayal of Lizzie.

The Rainmaker even inspired its own musical version, 110 in the Shade. Harvey Schmidt and Tom Jones (the musical-theater duo behind The Fantasticks and I Do! I Do!) collaborated to create 110 in the Shade, which opened at New York's Broadhurst Theatre on Oct. 23, 1963 and went on to play for 330 performances. Nash wrote the book for this musical version of his play, and legendary producer David Merrick hired Joseph Anthony – the director of the original 1954 source material – to direct it. The show earned four Tony Award nominations during the 1963-1964 Broadway season (including one for actor Will Geer, the musical's H.C., who years later would gain even wider fame as Grandpa on the long-running CBS-TV series The Waltons).

About the Playwright

N. Richard Nash was born as Nathan Richard Nasbaum in Philadelphia in 1913. In his youth, he trained as a boxer but then studied English and philosophy at the University of Philadelphia. Nash made his mark as a profific playwright, screenwriter and novelist. His Broadway debut came in a 1946 play about Shakespeare, The Second Best Bed. With The Rainmaker, Nash enjoyed a triple-run hit thanks to its 1954 Broadway production, the 1956 film adaptation and its 1963 musical version. The show emerged as his widest and most enduring success. "I tried to tell a simple story about droughts that happen to people, and about faith," he wrote in The New York Times in 1956. His adaptation for the film version of the play earned him a Writers Guild of America Award. His other screenplays include Helen of Troy in 1956 and the 1959 film version of Porgy and Bess. He wrote the books for the Broadway musicals The Happy Time (1968) and Wildcat (1961), the latter of which was a star vehicle for Lucille Ball. Between 1968 and 1969, he wrote 26 episodes of the ABC-TV series Here Come the Brides. His works of fiction include East Wind, Rain, published in 1977, which concerns the Dec. 7, 1941, bombing of Pearl Harbor, In 1956, he married his third wife, Katherine Copeland, who survived Nash when he died at the age of 87 in Manhattan on Dec. 11, 2000.



About Our Director

Bob Belfance (AEA, AFRTRA, SAG)

Bob is directing his 192nd production at Weathervane. In April he directed our very successful production of Enchanted April, Last October, Bob directed a wellreceived production of Brooklyn Boy at the Shaw Jewish Community Center. Bob left Broadway for Akron in 1961. In New York, Lee Strasberg invited Bob, then a fledgling director, to become an observer at the famous Actors Studio. When Bob became Weathervane's first Managing Director, he said his goal was to build a new state-of-the-art theater for Akron audiences. In 1970 Weathervane opened its season in this theater. Bob had been responsible for transforming Weathervane into one of Ohio's leading non-professional theaters. Bob wrote, produced and directed several award-winning films for Omnibus Film Productions (as one of 6 co-owners) and also owned and operated the Priscilla Beach Summer Theater. In 2002 Bob's life-long contribution to his art was recognized when he was inducted into the Ohio Community Theater Hall of Fame. Bob and his multitalented, award-winning-actress wife Carol (who appeared on our stage as Mrs. Graves in Enchanted April), have been seen and heard on TV and radio commercials all over the United States. For 10 years they owned and operated the Outback Inn Bed and Breakfast. They co-authored Beds, Breakfasts and Broadcasts, a very entertaining book about inn keeping and for four years were featured on Breakfast at the Outback, a radio talk show they broadcast from their B&B. Bob and Carol enjoy visiting with Bob's children: Leslie, who is the Executive Director of the Rockynol Retirement Community; Eve, an Akron Municipal Court Judge; Mark, a partner at Ernst & Young; and Carol's son, Jason, a Network Systems Engineer at Summa Health System. Between them they have produced six grandchildren, all of whom are happily sponed by the grandchildren.

Sally Griffin earned a BA of Fine Arts degree late in life. She had always been interested in painting still lifes, portraits and landscapes in oil, acrylics and water colors. She was also an antique dealer and took a liking to some of the quilts she encountered at antique shows and studied the patterns and techniques used to craft them. When lung disease made it impossible for her to continue working with volatile paints, she turned her artistic talents toward quilt making, took numerous classes to learn the techniques and traditional designs and set about imprinting her own style upon them. Always fascinated by color, she collected fabrics that intrigued her and then sought to find a quilt design into which she could incorporate them. Each quilt she made used classic designs modified to produce a vibrancy that she considered her trademark.

Given the time frame of The Rainmaker and the character of Lizzie Curry, quilts made by a strong, independent woma, seemed to be a good tie-in to the show This is a tribute exhibit. Sadly, Sally Griffin passed away a few months after I discussed having a show featuring her work at the theater. I wish to thank her family for helping me make this exhibit possible. HOLLY HUMES (Lizzie Curry) Holly was last seen on Weathervane's stage as Rose Arnott in Enchanted April. Prior to that show, she has also been seen on other local stages, including Coach House and Dobama. Her favorite roles include Poppy in Noises Off!, Catherine in Proof, Mae in Cat on a Hot Tin Roof, Yelena in Uncle Vanya, various roles in The Laramie Project, Dawn in Song of Survival, and Lil in V-E Day. Holly is a graduate of Kent State University, with a bachelor's degree in Russian Language and Soviet/East European Studies. She works as a chiropractic assistant at Fairlawn Family Chiropractic Center, and as an assistant speech coach at Wooster High School. She would like to thank her husband, Scott Custer, for all of his love and support.

DANE LEE (Bill Starbuck) is a Senior Exercise Specialist Major/Theatre Minor at Kent State University. His most recent works include Francisco in Ohio Shakepeare Festival's *Hamlet* and the Clown from Othello. This is Dane's second production at Weathervane, and he is once again thrilled for a fantastic opportunity such as this. He thanks his friends (both on and off stage) and his family, whose support he will forever be grateful for. ("Cry out, let daring word be spoken / from the stage, the silence broken. / Unbound, in lights, we freely live. / Then truth be voiced, and freely give.

JOHN C. FAZIO (H. C. Curry) is an attorney having practiced in the Cleveland area for 40 years and in the Akron area for three years. He has spent the last two of those years trying to retire! John has been active in community theater since 1971. You may remember him in the 1972 WCP production of Death of a Salesman directed by Larry Moran. Other acting credits include Long Day's Journey Into Night, Private Lives, Rashomon, Seascape, That Championship Season and Toys in the Attic. John has also directed several productions and has written a full-length play, Tightrope, which has had

a couple of staged readings. He lives in Akron with his wife, Mary, who is retired after a career in public relations. He has five children, she has two. All seven have left the nest.

VINCE RICHARDS (Noah Curry) is an Ohio native who is new to theater (unless you count his high school drama experience). For the past 20 years, he has worked in the transportation industry. He has many interests (maybe too many?) including, but not limited to, music, movies, books, computers and motorcycles. While this marks Vince's first appearance on the Weathervane mainstage, it is actually his second play; having performed backstage running sound and providing the voice for the Announcer in And tshe Winner Is. He wishes to thank Bob Belfance, John Hedges and the casts & crews of And The Winner Is and The Rainmaker for all of their support. He also thanks his family and friends for always believing in him.

JASON DAVIS (Jim Curry) is a student at Kent State University. You might have seen him as Algernon in our Young Actor production The Importance of Being Earnest last spring, or as Mercutio in Romeo and Juliet or as Philip in last fall's mainstage production of The Lion in Winter. Jason is a graduate of Firestone High School and has also performed at the Solon Center for the Arts.

JIM FIPPIN (File) has been acting, directing and otherwise engaged in theater in Northeast Ohio for more than 20 years. He has appeared on stage at Porthouse Theatre, WCP, Coach House Theatre, The Players Guild of Canton and with the Ohio Shakespeare Festival. His resume includes roles in Twelfth Night. Hamlet, The Lion in Winter, The Odd Couple, Uncle Vanya, The Real Thing and Custer. As Artistic Director of Coach House Theatre, Jim staged Chapter Two, Betrayal, Art, Cat on a Hot Tin Roof and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf? among others. In 2005, he was recognized by the Akron Area Arts Alliance as the area's



outstanding Theatre Artist. Jim earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Theatre from Otterbein College, where he met his wife, Elaine. Together, they live in Wadsworth with their daughter, Emelie.

BOB KENDERES (Sheriff Thomas) is happy to return to Weathervane. Since his appearance here in *The Full Monty*, Bob has played roles in *West Side Story* for Huntington Playhouse, *Blooms of Steel* and *ART* for TrueNorth Cultural Arts, *Drowning Sorrows* at Coach House Theatre, *Don't Drink the Water* at Strongsville Community Theater and *Damn Yankees* and *And Then There Was None* for Royalton Players. In 2005 he won a Best Actor award for his role of Otto Frank in the Royalton Players' production of *The Diary of Anne Frank*.

RICHARD WORSWICK (Stage Manager) was most recently in Weathervane's Dietz production of Someone Who'll Watch Over Me. Also for Weathervane he played roles in The Sisters Rosensweig, Noises Off, The Dinner Party, The Mystery of Irma Vep, The Laramie Project and The Chosen for which he won a Best Actor Chanticleer for his role of Reuben Malter. Richard chaired Weathervane's Gala in 2005. This is his first turn as Stage Manager.




