





A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members – Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch – and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/ Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of *Dark of the Moon* here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 81st Season.

Weathervane's Harris Family Gallery is pleased to have The Ohio Collage Society exhibit. Collage pieces, with their many layers and dimensions, seemed to be a good fit for this transmogrification of both the classic story of King Arthur and the Knights of the Roundtable, and the film comedy, *Monty Python and the Holy Grail.* All these story elements are similar to the creation of collage—different sources, materials, mediums, etc.

Collage is considered the only "new, fine art medium" of the 20th Century. Although Pablo Picasso added pasted elements into some early paintings in spring 1912, it was Georges Braque who initiated "the pasted paper revolution" in autumn 1912. He shared a studio with Picasso, who was away in Paris. Picasso's explosive response to Braque's new medium helped push collage into the realm of fine art and the future.

Collage continues to be a dynamic and diverse contemporary art form more than a century later in 2016. This exhibit demonstrates the same interest in materials, imagery, colors, and an altered reality that Picasso and Braque explored 100 years ago. Collage artists construct a world made from the fragments and cast offs of the modern age for us to consider in their art.

The Ohio Collage Society (OCS) was founded in 2007 by Gretchen Bierbaum, and is an affiliate of the National Collage Society (NCS), which Ms. Bierbaum established in 1982. The OCS seeks to strengthen interest in the modern technique of collage and to support collage artists in Ohio by providing exhibit opportunities, support and meetings to exchange information and create collage. OCS has had 10 annual member exhibits since 2006 and a number of other exhibits in a variety of gallery venues in Oho. They are an enthusiastic and eclectic group of artists who always welcome new members. This exhibit honors the memory of Christine Paringer, a talented, vibrant artist and dedicated member of the Ohio Collage Society. Chris was the liaison between this gallery and the OCS. She will be greatly missed by her friends, her peers and the many people whose lives she touched through her love of art.



The Place: Medieval England and here The Time: 932 A.D. and now

There will be one 15-minute intermission.

Lovingly ripped off from the classic film *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*, the uproarious musical comedy *Spamalot* retells the legend of King Arthur and his Knights of the Round Table, and features a bevy of beautiful show girls — not to mention cows, killer rabbits, and flatulent French people. Did we mention the bevy of beautiful show girls?

King Arthur, traveling with his servant Patsy, recruits several knights to accompany him on his quest to find the elusive Holy Grail, including Sir Bedevere, Sir Robin, Sir Lancelot and Sir Galahad. Besides the murderous rabbits and farting Frenchman, they meet such characters as the Lady of the Lake, Prince Herbert, Tim the Enchanter, Not Dead Fred, the Black Knight and the Knights who say Ni.

Armed with the slightly demented (yet always hilarious) humor of the famed comedy troupe known as Monty Python, *Spamalot* overturns a legendary tale of brave knights and their daring deeds to deliver a musical comedy packed full of silly shenanigans, memorably funny songs and hysterical hijinks.

The original Broadway production of *Monty Python's Spamalot* was nominated for 14 Tony Awards and won three (including Best Musical for the 2004-2005 season). The show, directed by Mike Nichols, opened March 17, 2005, at the Shubert Theatre in New York City. After 34 previews and 1,575 performances, the production closed on Jan. 11, 2009. According to Playbill. com, *Monty Python's Spamalot* was seen by more than 2 million people on Broadway and grossed over \$175 million (after recouping its initial production costs in under six months!). The show's original cast recording won the Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album in 2006.

ABOUT THE SHOW'S CREATORS

ERIC IDLE (book and lyrics) has multihyphenated his way through life assiduously avoiding a proper job, from a writer and actor in the legendary Monty Python TV series and movies, to the creator and director of The Rutles, the pre-fab four (whose legend will last a lunchtime). He has appeared on stage in drag singing rude songs at Carnegie Hall and the Hollywood Bowl as well as performing in two highly successful tours, Eric Idle Exploits Monty Python (2000) and The Greedy Bastard Tour (2003), for which he journeyed 15,000 miles across North America in a bus. His Greedy Bastard Diary of that tour is published by Harper Collins. His play, Pass the Butler, ran for five months in London's West End. He has written two novels (Hello, Sailor and The Road to Mars), a children's book (The Quite Remarkable Adventures of the Owl and the Pussycat) and a bedside companion (The Rutland Dirty Weekend Book).

JOHN Du PREZ (music), a Trevelyan Scholar at Christ Church, Oxford, and Associate of the Royal College of Music, entered the film industry in 1978 composing additional music for Monty Python's Life of Brian. This began a long association with Eric Idle, leading eventually to their current writing partnership. He has scored more than 20 feature films including The Meaning of Life, A Private Function, A Fish Called Wanda, Once Bitten, UHF and Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles I, II and III. Other Python projects include The Contractual Obligation Album, Monty Python at the Hollywood Bowl and The Fairly Incomplete & Rather Badly Illustrated Monty Python Song Book. He was musical director for Eric Idle's two North American stage tours, Eric Idle Exploits Monty Python (2000) and The Greedy Bastard Tour (2003).




