A BRIEF HISTORY OF WEATHERVANE PLAYHOUSE

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley ...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members - Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935, the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan, with the other founders, offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938, a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. This group is now the Volunteer Guild.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1474 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/ Director. He held the position from 1961-1969 and from 1974-1992. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned.

During the 1960s, the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed: these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was completed in 2009 in time for the opening of the 75th season. Weathervane is proud to celebrate its 82nd season.

The Frankenstein Evolution: From Mary Wollstonecraft Shelley's novel: Frankenstein or the Modern Prometheus to Frankenberry, the cereal and Original Fantasy Artwork by Robert A. Kraus

This exhibit has two complementary components. The first explores the beginning of the Frankenstein story as written by Mary Wollstonecraft Shelly. This frightening story was written as part of a competition to write 'ghost stories' among Mary, her husband, Percy Bysshe Shelley, Lord Byron, and Dr. John Polidori during a stormy evening at Villa Diodati near Geneva, Switzerland in June 1816. The story Mary wrote was the beginning of her book *Frankenstein or the Modern Prometheus* which was published anonymously in 1818.

This was the beginning of the Frankenstein legend, which was most iconically brought to the silver screen in 1931 with Boris Karloff playing the Monster. That movie, however, and most other films made about Frankenstein's monster, were not true to Mary Shelley's original story. Kenneth Branagh's *Mary Shelley's Frankenstein* (1994) was closer to the original story than others.

Libby Jacobs, Artistic Director at Coach House Theatre from the early '80's until 1992, and frequent guest director at Weathervane Community Playhouse, wrote an original play, *Sparks* which was produced at Coach House from November 15 to December 8, 1984. Her script was a faithful adaptation of Shelley's original story. The production received favorable reviews. It was also produced in 2000 at Tree City Players in Kent, and was part of the former Salon Series at Weathervane. The plays directed by Libby Jacobs at Weathervane frequently won the Chanticleer Award for Best Play. Among those were *Lost in Yonkers*, and *To Kill a Mockingbird*. She and her husband, Dr. John Jacobs, provided the original funding for The Libby and Jack Jacobs Library on Weathervane's second floor. Libby and Jack now reside in Wexford, PA.

Other elements of this exhibit trace the transition of Frankenstein from a feared monster to a humorous, engaging character such as Herman Munster as portrayed by Fred Gwynne in the TV series *The Munsters*.

And, of course, the monster character in our current production, Young Frankenstein, the Musical.

The second component of this display features the work of Robert A. Kraus, well-known local fantasy artist. He is the owner/creator of RAK Graphics. His original artwork presents unique interpretations of Frankenstein's Monster and other characters. He's also provided movie posters embellished with his original artwork. Robert is the creator of *RAK Attack Monsters*, and *Superfreeks*. He also is the sole designer of the board game, *Dragon War* and the hundreds of expansions to go with it. Robert is involved in many Comic Cons throughout the year including the San Diego Comic Con and many of the Wizard World Cons. He's always happy to meet his many fans at these events. ABOUT THE PLAY

Talking With... is a play comprised of monologues, each eight to ten minutes long and featuring a different female character who talks about her life and her own personal ordeals.

These extraordinary monologues received a standing ovation when they premiered at famed Kentucky regional theater company Actors Theatre of Louisville. These idiosyncratic characters amuse, move and frighten, always speaking from the depths of their souls. They include a baton twirler, a fundamentalist snake handler, an ex-rodeo rider and an actress willing to go to any length to get a job.

Many of the monologues are touching, some are intensely emotional, and a couple are even comical. All of the pieces, however, show how the varied experiences and events in ones life affect who we are as humans.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

JANE MARTIN (Playwright) is a Kentuckian who first came to national attention for Talking With..., a collection of monologues premiering in Actors Theatre of Louisville's 1982 Humana Festival of New American Plays. Since its New York premiere at Manhattan Theatre Club in 1982, Talking With... has been performed around the world, winning the Best Foreign Play of the Year Award in Germany from *Theatre Heute* magazine. Her other work includes: Vital Signs, Cementville, Keely And Du (Pulitzer Prize nominee; 1994 American Theatre Critics Association Best New Play Award), Jack And Jill (1997 American Theatre Critics Association Best New Play Award), Anton In Show Business (2001 American Theatre Critics/ Steinberg Principal Citation), Mr. Bundy, and Flaming Guns Of The Purple Sage. Good Boys premiered at Guthrie Theater in 2002. Flags was co-produced by Guthrie Theater and Mixed Blood in 2004, and her most recent work, Sez She, premiered at Illusion Theatre in April 2006.

I liken *Talking With...* to a provocative symphonic concert with 11 different movements. Each movement has a different rhythm, evokes different responses, but at the same time also reflects and comments upon the others. While each story is uniquely told through a female voice, they all speak to the human condition and our desire to experience and understand love, intimacy, loss, disappointment, pain, joy, the divine.

The women you meet tonight have a story they need to share with you. A story they hope touches you and changes you in some way. We all need our humanity to be witnessed and acknowledged.
