A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse

From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...

Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run as a live theater in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.

Their first problem was money to pay the rent and to cover production costs. Money was in short supply in 1935 so the women chose a carnival as their fundraiser. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60 which encouraged them to continue. They named their space Weathervane after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cléaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935 the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan with the other founders offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938 a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. It, too, continues to this day.

The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1471 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because there were fewer and fewer people willing to commit to directing a play, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. Belfance held the position from 1961-69 and again from 1974-92. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned. During the 1960s the membership planned, plotted and raised funds. It all came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon. There was ample space and a mortgage. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Two major additions to the facility followed; these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop in 2005 became the John L. Dietz Studio/Theater/Classroom, where experimental productions are presented.

Weathervane Playhouse now looks forward to a third expansion and a 75th anniversary.




From Our Executive Director

About the Play

Perfect Wedding depicts a wedding day gone astray. Groom-to-be Bill wakes up on the morning of his nuptials and finds an extremely attractive woman nestled next to him. Trouble is, she's not his bride-to-be! Stung with a fierce hangover thanks to the preceding night's stag-party mischief, Bill can't recall how he met this woman named Judy or how she got into his bed – but he knows it doesn't look good!

The sudden arrival of his wisecracking best man, Tom, and Rachel, his determined bride, forces Bill to think quickly on his feet. He convinces Tom to pretend that Judy is his new girlfriend. Added into this merry mix are a clueless chambermaid and an emotional mother of the bride, who each throw a wacky wrench into the whole proceedings.

Well before any vows can be exchanged, many doors will slam, several identities will be mistaken, and a host of comical deceptions will create comedic havoc in playwright Robin Hawdon's perfectly hilarious play.

Even though the play has never received a major New York production either on Broadway or off, British import *Perfect Wedding* has become a popular staple of amateur theater groups as well as professional regional theaters across the United States and Canada.



About the Playwright

Englishman Robin Hawdon was born in 1939 in Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Before emerging as a playwright, he began his career as an actor in a number of British movies and television programs. At the same time, he took several stage roles in his native country, appearing in London's West End theatre district as well as with several provincial theatre companies. His first major commercial success as a playwright came with *The Mating Game*, a comedy that enjoyed a two-year run in London in the early 1970s. Hawdon's best-known plays – such as *Birthday Suite*, *Don't Rock the Boat*, *Shady Business* and *Don't Dress for Dinner* – often combine fast-paced comedy with a healthy dose of sentimental romance. One departure from this template was his 2000 play *God and Stephen Hawking*, which was inspired by the metaphysical theories of famed mathematician Hawking's best-selling book, *A Brief History of Time*.
