



A Brief History of Weathervane Playhouse


From the "barn" to Copley Road to the Valley...


Weathervane Community Playhouse began its run in 1935. Four artistically talented Woman's City Club members -- Grace Hower Crawford, Muriel MacLachlan, Laurine Schwan, Helen Troesch -- and a core of charter members rented the empty carriage house belonging to Akron's Senator Charles Dick. Their goal was to present a wide spectrum of plays: classics, dramas, comedies, new works – even opera – with casting open to anyone who fit a part.


The women chose a carnival as their fundraiser to start paying the rent. Despite a drenching downpour, they raised \$60. They named their space "Weathervane" after the rooster on the barn's cupola. After cleaning their new home, scrounging for seats, a curtain and a coffee pot, Weathervane opened its first season. During that summer of 1935 the group presented seven fully costumed and staged plays. In 1936, Muriel MacLachlan with the other founders offered classes to children and adults, beginning a tradition that has become today's Education Department. In 1938 a Women's Board was formed to offer volunteer financial assistance. It, too, continues to this day.


The "barn" was home until it was sold. In 1951 the Playhouse purchased a cement block building at 1471 Copley Road and renovated it for a theater with seating capacity of 125. The all-volunteer organization hired its first employee, Nora Scott, as custodian/ticket manager. Actual management of the Playhouse was handled by the Operating Board, which reported to the Board of Trustees. Because directors were becoming scarce, the Board hired Bob Belfance as full-time Manager/Director. He held the position from 1961-69 and from 1974-92. During the Copley Road days, plays were presented six days a week. Because of their popularity, not everyone who wanted to see a show could be accommodated. A new home was planned. During the 1960s the membership's plans came together in June 1970 with the opening of Dark of the Moon here on Weathervane Lane. Longtime friend and founder Grace Hower Crawford died in 1971, remembering the Playhouse in her will. Her money enabled the Board to pare down the mortgage and set up an Endowment Fund. The last mortgage payment was made in 1974 through a contribution of the Women's Board. Three major additions followed; these included first-floor restrooms, classrooms, a costume shop, fly gallery and elevator. The former scene shop became the John L. Dietz Theater/Classroom in 2005 and the lobby project was just completed for the opening of the 75th season.

I'm pleased to announce that the Harris Family Gallery is the first to feature an exhibition comprised solely of the artwork created by Gary D. Lichten, M.D. It is a bit unusual for a person so devoted to medicine to also have a passion for making art. We are the beneficiaries of that passion. Although this is our first look at Dr. Lichten's work, his patients have been enjoying his striking ceramic confections for several years, as many of these pieces are displayed throughout his office complex.

Dr. Lichten received his B.S. degree (Magna Cum Laude) from The University of Akron. He received his M.D. degree from The Ohio State University. He is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American Board of Dermatology. Dr. Lichten is affiliated with Summa Health Systems, Akron General Medical Center and Children's Hospital Medical Center. Dr. Lichten has been chosen as one of the "Top Doctors of the Year" for Dermatology from 1998 through 2010 by Cleveland Magazine and Northern Ohio Live Magazine.

Robert Yost has been his ceramics teacher from 2007 to the present. In addition to this exhibit, Dr. Lichten had a piece accepted in the Sixth Annual Juried Show, "Fresh Art," at Summit Artspace, displayed May 1 thru June 5, 2010. Dr. Lichten says, "My artwork creations are meant to stir emotions, revisit pleasant memories and have the observer stop and study the work in all its detail. The artwork is textural and multidimensional to further enhance the observer's experience and more closely simulate nature. The wonders of nature are complex as are the detailed impressions on the petals, which are representative of these intricacies."

The Wedding Singer takes place in 1985. What was Weathervane doing in 1985?

The Dining Room, a comedy of manners by A.R. Gurney, kicked off 1985. That was followed by Amadeus, the brilliant exploration of Mozart's life. The Moss Hart comedy, Light Up the Sky, was next on the schedule and was the third time we had performed the play. A Sondheim revue, You're Gonna Love Tomorrow opened in May and the 1984-1985 season closer was Foxfire. The 1985-1986 season opened with a revue of Cole Porter songs appropriately titled Cole. In October, Rope, a story based loosely on the Leopold and Loeb murder case, chilled audiences. Finally, the last play of 1985 was the presentation of the Women's Board Holiday Show, Rumpelstiltskin.




From Our Executive Director

About the Musical and Creators

About the Show's History

The world premiere of *The Wedding Singer* took place in February 2006 at the 5th Avenue Theatre in Seattle, Washington. The show opened on Broadway at the Al Hirschfeld Theatre on April 27, 2006, where it played for a total of 285 performances before closing on Dec. 31, 2006. The original Broadway production was directed by John Rando; the choreographer was Rob Ashford. The show received five Tony Award nominations (Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical, Best Original Score, Best Actor in a Musical, Best Choreography), eight Drama Desk Award nominations and three Drama League Award nominations. The first national tour of the musical traveled across the United States from August 2007 to June 2008. The second national tour opened in September 2009 and remained on the road in the United States and Canada through March 2010. *The Wedding Singer* has also been produced in the United Kingdom, Sweden, Japan, Australia and Spain.

About the Show's Creators

Composer Matthew Sklar was born in 1973 and grew up in Westfield, New Jersey. In 1991, he graduated as a composition major from the Juilliard School Pre-College Division and then continued his studies at New York University. He began working on Broadway at the age of 18 as an associate conductor or rehearsal pianist for such shows as Les Miserables, Miss Saigon, Titanic, On the Town, Annie Get Your Gun, Putting It Together, 42nd Street, Oklahoma!, Nine and Caroline, or Change. He is the recipient of the Gilman & Gonzalez-Falla Musical Theater Award and the Jonathan Larson Performing Arts Foundation Award.

Lyricist and co-book writer **Chad Beguelin** was born in 1969. He holds a Master's of Fine Arts degree from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts (from its graduate writing program). With his *Wedding Singer* collaborator Matthew Sklar, his other plays include *The Rhythm Club* and *Wicked City*. He is the recipient of the Jonathan Larson Performing Arts Foundation Award, the Edward Kleban Award for Outstanding Lyric Writing and the Gilman & Gonzalez-Falla Musical Theater Award. He lives in New York City.

Co-book writer Tim Herlihy was born in Brooklyn, New York, in 1966. A frequent collaborator with Adam Sandler, he is a graduate of New York School of Law. He wrote the screenplay for the 1998 film *The Wedding Singer*, the source material for the stage musical. His other screenplays include *Bedtime Stories, Mr. Deeds, Little Nicky, Big Daddy, The Waterboy, Happy Gilmore* and *Billy Madison*. He also served as staff writer for NBC-TV's *Saturday Night Live* from 1993 to 2000.

About Our Directing Team

Pierre-Jacques Brault (Director and Choreographer) is a graduate of Baldwin-Wallace College's Music Theatre Department and is the co-founder of Mercury Summer Stock, which enters its 13th season this summer at the Cleveland Play House. He has directed countless shows, ranging from full-scale musicals (such as *Evita* and *Annie*) to lesser-known plays (including *Never the Sinner*). His favorite directing credit was putting together the critically acclaimed musical *Honk!* As an actor, Pierre has worked with Broadway legends Donna McKechnie and Pamela Myers and has assisted some of today's top directors and choreographers, including Cleveland's own Victoria Bussert. Weathervane Playhouse audiences saw him in the 2008 Dietz Theater production of *Love! Valour! Compassion!*, in which he played Ramon. His work has also been seen at Cain Park, Willoughby Fine Arts, Chagrin Valley Little Theatre and Stagedoor Manor, a theatrical camp in upstate New York.

Margaret Knepper (Musical Director) has a long career as an actor, singer, director, music director and costume designer. She is very happy to be back to serve as musical director for *The Wedding Singer*.

For many years Margaret was both a director and musical director for *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* here at Weathervane. She was also involved with many youth theatre productions and taught musical theatre classes.
